PROJECTS

The major project in the district is the Shell Creek Addition/Renovation. At the present time the project is moving forward as expected. The tentative completion date is near the 15th of July. I am a little more conservative on my estimate and would look for an August 1 date for the majority of the work to be finished with some odds and ends to be worked on right up to near the middle of August.

The district is also working on some projects at the Lakeview and Platte Center buildings. The tuck-pointing of the Lakeview building has just been completed. Some exterior lighting has been updated at the Platte Center building and carpet is being replaced in two rooms as I write this article. The district hopes to upgrade some of the lighting in both buildings before the start of school. There are many other small projects along with the major cleaning of each building.

BUDGET

Over the past three years, the Board has done a good job of putting money into the depreciation fund and into the cash reserve fund. The depreciation fund can be used to replace

items that are wearing out. This would include technology, carpet and roofs to name a few allowable uses. The money in the cash reserve fund helps the district to pay its bills without borrowing money and paying more interest. The budget process for the 2012-2013 school year is currently underway and will be the focus of our work in the district office for most of July and August. As in the past, the board will make a concentrated effort to keep our tax asking as low as possible, while making sure that we continue to offer a quality education to all of our students.

FUTURE

In today's society all businesses are competitive in nature and more than ever so are school districts. If our vision for the future is to maintain quality educational programs, competitive activities and to prepare our students for the ability to be successful in the future, we must also be competitive with other educational institutions. This will mean that we need to offer quality educational opportunities, provide quality facilities and be on the cutting edge of programs offered. I would hope that you would agree that we need to continue to be a progressive school district that will attract families to our district and school.



Lunch Room News

Hello my name is Jenny Sloup. I am the food service manager here at Lakeview Community Schools. I have only been here for a year but I truly love it. I have made many changes that you may have seen or heard about throughout the year and there will definitely be more to come. I recently have gone to a NTENT training course (Nebraska Training and Education for Nutrition Teams) to learn more about the changes to the USDA's meal pattern requirements for the 2012-13 year.

These changes include:

Milk: All flavored milk must be skim (fat-free), unflavored milk must be skim or 1 % (low fat).

Bread/ Grains: We have been set a minimum and maximum number of grains/breads that can be served weekly and daily. At least 50% of the grains must be whole-grain rich define as one of the following:

- ◆ Count 8 grams of whole grain per serving
- ◆ Carries the FDA whole grain health claim

Whole grain must be the primary grains ingredient by weight.

Fruits and Vegetables: Students must now take at least ½ a cup of fruits or vegetables daily.

Fruits: K-8 must be offered ½ cup daily; 9-12 must be offered 1 cup daily.

Vegetables: There are daily and weekly portion requirements which include specific sub groups:


- ◆ Dark green vegetables – broccoli, romaine, spinach, etc.
- ◆ Dark orange/red vegetables – carrot, pumpkin, red peppers, etc.
- ◆ Legumes – black beans, kidney beans, garbanzo beans, etc.
- ◆ Starchy vegetables – corn, peas, potatoes, etc.
- ◆ Other vegetables – green beans, cucumbers, and cauliflower, etc.

Meat/Meat Alternate: Commercially prepared tofu and soy yogurt can now be served as part of a reimbursable meal.

Calories: There is also a minimum and maximum calorie intake we must have for each meal:

- ◆ K-5: 550-650 calories
- ◆ 6-8: 600-700 calories
- ◆ 9-12: 750-850 calories

With all the changes it will take some time to get used to it. I hope this will help you understand what is going on in the lunch room.

Important Information for Students Wanting to Take Dual Credit Courses

MAP- Mandatory Assessment and Placement, Central Community College will begin implementing MAP procedures. Beginning this summer, high school students now fall under the mandatory assessment and placement guidelines. This means that any student wanting to take a college level course or a dual credit course at Lakeview must first take a placement test and receive the appropriate score before they can enroll in a dual credit course. If a student does not meet the appropriate score the first time they can retest to try to raise their score. Any student not meeting the minimum score will not be allowed to enroll in the course, waivers are no longer accepted.



Groundwater Festival: Shell Creek 5th Grade Field Trip
