### From The Superintendent's Desk — By Mr. Freeman

In the last week we have went from no snow to having 6+ inches on the ground with more snow possible for the next several days. We now have missed 3 full days of school due to weather situations. If we continue to have more snow, which causes delays or cancelation of school, please remember that you must make the decision if it is safe in your area for your son or daughter to travel to school. The school will respect your decision to keep your child at home or to have them arrive late and will assist him/her in getting missed schoolwork made up.

### **ENERGY SAVINGS**

Some of the projects involving new lighting at Lakeview and Platte Center and the new HVAC system at Shell Creek have qualified the district for rebates on the products purchased. We have already received one rebate for the new lighting in the shop area and at Platte Center. We anticipate receiving at least one more rebate for the lighting installed in the Lakeview classrooms and for the HVAC system at Shell Creek. We thank for Loup Power and Cornhusker Power for helping us with acquiring these rebates.

### **DISTRICT PROJECTS**

At the February board meeting two additional projects were approved. I will briefly explain those projects and give you an update on other projects in the following paragraphs.

Security: Several cameras have been installed at the Shell Creek elementary since the last newsletter. This addition plus the buzzer system to gain entrance has greatly improved the security at the elementary.

Lighting Project: The board approved moving ahead with the installation of more energy efficient lighting in the following areas: wood shop and wood shop classroom, agriculture classroom and office, music room & the English/journalism room. The new lighting in these areas will be more efficient and should also qualify for a small rebate. This project should begin at the end of March.

East Gym Ventilation: The board decided to move forward on a project to improve the ventilation in the east gym. This project will help with the air flow and on most days keep the temperature at a more reasonable level. This project will take place before the next school year, as it must be coordinated with scheduled activities.

Varsity Football Field: The improvement of the grass on the varsity football field is in progress. So far, a topographical survey has been professionally completed and soil samples have been sent to a lab specializing in turf issues. Once we get the results from the soil tests, we will continue to move forward with this project.

### The Bullied, part 2

This month's newsletter is the 2<sup>nd</sup> part of a 3 part series. In January's newsletter I wrote an article titled, **The Bully**, the article is still posted on my Principal's webpage if you would like to read it, the article provided helpful information on the topic of bullying. In the article I included a definition of bullying from Barbara Coloroso which states:

<u>Bullying</u>- is a conscious, willful and deliberate, hostile activity which is intended to harm.

Along with the definition of bullying, I included the Four Markers of a Bully. The Four Markers of a Bully are guidelines which help parents and teachers identify bullying. Also included in last month's article were guidelines on the differences between Teasing and Taunt-

ing. We all know in today's social culture there is a lot of sarcasm, teasing, trash talk and banter among friends and siblings. Most of the time when friends and siblings participate in this type of banter it is playful and it is not intended to harm. However, there are kids, (bullies or kids who are socially unaware) who use this type of sarcasm, trash talk and banter to be mean and harmful towards other students. The difficult task for us sometimes is trying to determine if it was playful teasing or harmful taunting. Understanding the differences of teasing and taunting can help parents, teachers and students deal with these situations. Landscaping Work: There has been some discussion on what to do at the Shell Creek elementary to produce some grassy areas for recess and recreation and also what landscaping needs to be done to improve the appearance of the school site. This will be discussed in committee and then brought to the full board for approval.

### PILOT EVALUATION

The Lakeview District, along with approximately 19 other school districts, is participating in the Nebraska pilot teacher and administrator evaluation program. This year we are learning about evaluation programs, adapting them to the Nebraska Teaching and Administrator Standards and learning about the process of implementing this program. At the end of this year a model evaluation process should be developed that

the Lakeview District will implement during the 2013-14 school year. As we learn more, I will try to keep you updated with information in the newsletter.

### WALK FOR EDUCATION

It is planned to hold a fundraising activity for the Lakeview Education Foundation, which will involve students being involved in getting pledges for walking in a healthy and fun activity. The profits from this activity will be used for the scholarship fund that provides financial assistance for Lakeview graduates each year. Barbara Coloroso is considered to be a leading expert in bullying and speaks nationally on the topic. In last month's newsletter my main intent was to give you some good information on how to identify bullying. However, within the last article I did not cover the aftermath of bullying, when a child is bullied he or she is not always willing to share what has happened. Therefore, we as parents and teachers must be knowledgeable of how to identify – "The Bullied." This leaves us with the question: How can we as parents and teachers identify and support students and kids who are being bullied?

Again this information can be found at the above website, created by Barbara Coloroso. Coloroso states the one thing which all kids who are bullied have in common is that a bully or bullies have targeted them. Each bullied student was singled out to be the object of scorn, and thus the recipient of bullying, often times because he or she was different in some way. Coloroso goes even further and helps us identify possible warning signs from students who are being bullied:

### The Warning Signs:

 Shows an abrupt lack of interest in school, or refuses to go to school.

- Takes an unusual route to school.
- 3. Suffers a drop in grades.
- 4. Withdraws from family and school activities.
- 5. Is overly hungry after school.
- 6. Steals money from home.
- 7. Makes a bee line to the bathroom when arriving home
- 8. Is sad, sullen, angry, or scared after receiving a phone call or e-mail.
- 9. Does something out of character.
- 10. Has torn or missing clothes.
- 11. Uses derogatory or demeaning language when talking about peers.
- 12. Stops talking about peers and everyday activities.
- 13. Has physical injuries not consistent with explanation.
- 14. Has stomachaches, headaches, panic attacks, is unable to sleep, sleeps too much, is exhausted.
- 15. Plays alone, or prefers to hang with adults.

Some of these warning signs might be merely some characteristics of normal adolescents, but if you have concerns it may be something to keep a closer eye on or even read more about at the above website. Until next month – Go Vikings!

Call to Order – Chairman Runge called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Loseke led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The meeting was turned over to Superintendent Freeman. He delivered the Oath of Office to

Superintendent Freeman turned the meeting over to President Runge.

Facility Improvements - Lighting - It was moved by Loseke and seconded by Schreiber to install lights in the west classrooms as indicated by the pink area on the display map. Football field - It was moved by Mueller and seconded by Loseke to remove the grass from the football field, re-crown, and put a new hardier grass down. There was discussion

concerning the maintenance of the field. On roll call vote, Pabian, yes; Schreiber, no; Loseke, yes; Jaixen, yes; Mueller, yes; and Runge, no. Motion carried 4-2. Shell Creek Security - It was moved by Pabian and seconded by Jaixen to approve up to \$10,000 for a camera system, allowing the Building and Grounds Committee to check on the cost of IP cameras before making a final decision. On roll call vote, Schreiber, yes; Loseke, yes; Jaixen, yes; Mueller, yes; Pabian, yes; and Runge, yes. Motion carried.

Transportation - The board requested additional information, including the cost of paying mileage to bus kids who attend both elementary schools, cost of current busing contract including fuel and monitor pay and the cost of mileage for the junior high students who ride from Platte Center to Lakeview, before making a decision on the busing contract for the 2013-2014 school year.

Board Goals - The 2012 Board Goals were provided. It was decided to review and revise during committee meetings in the near future.

After School Program - An update on attendance and financial status was given.

Appointment of Educational Lobbvist - The board reviewed the potential cost of sharing a lobbyist with two other schools. All options will be researched before a commitment is made.

### **Discussion Items**

Board Committee Reports -Committee activity was discussed. The Building and Grounds Committee will set up dates to visit about the gym ventilation system. The Curriculum Committee will meet either on Jan. 28 or 30.

### Other Items to Discuss

a. Board Advisory Meeting -January 21 - Agenda: ITBS, iPads and External Review. Need to choose a new vice president and add a couple of new members, with one being James Wilke.


b. Board/Staff Recognition -This will be held on the teachers' last day.

### What happens after you submit the FAFSA?

If you recently submitted your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), or will soon do so, here's what will happen next:

### \*Expect your SAR

You will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR) acknowledging that your form was processed. If necessary, you can use the SAR to make corrections to your FAFSA.

### \*Did you use IRS Data Retrieval?

If you did not use IRS Data Retrieval when you filed your FAFSA, EducationQuest encourages you to "correct your FAFSA" and use IRS Data Retrieval to input income tax data for you and your parents. Review this flyer for instructions. If you don't use IRS Data Retrieval, your college (s) may require you to provide a copy of your IRS tax transcript.

### \*Expect a financial aid award notification

The colleges you listed on the FAFSA will send you a financial aid award notification (by mail or electronically) detailing the assistance they're offering. They may offer a combination of scholarships, grants, work-study and student loans. Respond to each notification (most students accept all award packages until they make their final college selection).

### \*Compare award notifications

Use the <u>Award Letter Comparison Calculator</u> at **Education-Quest.org** to determine which school offers the best financial aid package.

### \*Keep looking for scholarships!

Many local, state and national scholarships have deadlines in March, April and May. For local and state scholarships, visit <u>ScholarshipQuest</u> at **EducationQuest.org**.

### Juniors: It's time to start your campus visits

Start looking at colleges your junior year so you can narrow your choices by the time you're a senior. If your school has a spring break, that's a perfect time to schedule a campus visit. Follow these tips:

**Explore your career interests.** Before you determine which colleges you want to visit, think about your career interests and then research colleges that fit your interests.

Check out college websites. You'll find admission requirements, academic and social information, and campus photos or a virtual tour.

Schedule your visits at least two weeks in advance. Ask for appointments with an admissions representative, financial aid counselor, and a faculty member in your area of interest.

Visit your top college choices while the schools are in session. You won't get the true flavor of the school during breaks or finals week. Here are questions to ask while on a campus visit.

Talk to a faculty member about upperlevel classes in your anticipated major. This will help you understand the coursework that will be required and the degree of difficulty.

Ask the financial aid counselor how the college may offset tuition costs and about college-based scholarship applications and deadlines.
