From The Superintendent's Desk — By Mr. Freeman

As I write this portion of the newsletter, the weather is starting to turn cooler. It seems like only last week the heat was an issue with outside activities. As we switch from summer to fall, I am reminded about how fast time seems to go by each year.

It is also somewhat difficult to believe that we are in the 5th week of school. It seems like the school year just started and now we are starting to think about the end of the quarter. From my viewpoint the school year seems to be off to an excellent start. This year it seems like we have more new students than in the past, but maybe that is just my perception. The only thing that has not changed is that we again have another outstanding group of students this year. I greatly appreciate the opportunity to work with the students and staff in the Lakeview District.

In this portion of the newsletter I will give you a brief summary of the 2013-2014 budget, a report on the district enrollment and an update on a couple of other items.

SOFTBALL PROJECT

During the first part of August there was a flurry of activity at the Lakeview Softball Field as volunteers and hired workers took on the task of removing the old concession stand and announcer's area

and installing a new concession stand and press box. We greatly thank those who donated time, expertise and equipment to make this project ready for the start of the season. At this time I believe that there are a few things yet to be completed, but this is a great example of what a community working together can accomplish.. A big thank you goes out to all involved in making this project possible.

2013-2014 BUDGET

The school board approved the budget for the 2013-2014 school year at the September 9, 2013 meeting. The tax asking is as follows:

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This year the district valuation is \$1,096,333,279 compared to last year's the district valuation of \$990,078,737. Overall, this is about an 11% increase in the district's valuation.

ENROLLMENT

As we are about to enter into the month of October, I thought you might like to have today's enrollment count. K-57, 1-33, 2-48, 3-40, 4-56, 5-44, 6-48, 7-63, 8-59, 9-71, 10-59, 11-70, 12-74 = 722 total students. By building the enrollment breaks down as follows: SC: K-39, 1-17, 2-31, 3-24, 4-40, 5-29, 6-35 = 215 total students; PC: K-18, 1-16, 2-17, 3-16, 4-16, 5-15, 6-13 = 111 total students; JH: 7-63, 8-59 = 122 total students; HS: 9-71, 10-59, 11-70, 12-74 = 274 total students. Christ Lutheran is reporting 27 total students and St. John's is reporting 19 total students.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Both elementary schools (Platte Center & Shell Creek) are running an after school program to help out parents who cannot pick up their children immediately after school. This After School Program is being implemented on a trial basis again this year. The program is being offered as a service for our district patrons and must be financially self-supporting for it to continue. If you have an interest in using this program, please contact the appropriate elementary school for information.

NeSA Results from Mr. Borer ~ 7-12 Principal~

Scores on the Nebraska State Accountability tests (NeSA) were released to the public on Tuesday, August 27th. All students in grades 3-8 and 11 in public schools are tested in Reading, Math. Students in grade 5, 8 and 11 are tested in Science and students in grades 4, 8 and 11 are tested in Writing. The NeSA tests are based on the Nebraska state standards. After students take the tests student scores are converted into a scale score ranging from 0-200.

A student's scale score is then placed in one of three categories: "Below Standards" (a scale score from 0-85), "Meet Standards" (a scale score from 86-134), and "Exceeds Standards" (a scale score from 135-200). About two or three weeks ago parents of the above tested students should have received an individual student report showing them how their child performed on the 2013 NeSA tests.

The chart below shows you the % of students meeting proficiency during the past 4 years at all grade levels in the Lakeview Community Schools' school system. Although we have demonstrated considerable gains, there are still areas that we need to improve upon, as a staff we will continue to assess and study our data to improve the academic instruction and curriculum for our students.

As you look at the NeSA data it is important to remember that all these state tests are summative in nature, meaning they are taken one time at the end of the year. It is a snapshot of a student's performance at that particular time. Over a longer period of time the data provides a clearer picture of how our students are performing. Classroom assessments and National Standardized assessments are also used as a part of the overall picture in how our students are performing. In the past 4 years there has been a lot of news about the new state NeSA tests. School districts in Nebraska have been placed under a microscope like never before in history. Much of this accountability is good and helps our school districts improve and focus on what's important in teaching and learning. However, schools, business leaders, politicians and patrons all need to be careful about placing too much emphasis on a one time snap shot test. The test is only taken one time during the school year in the Spring semester, and is not always a true reflection of what a child has learned throughout the year. The results of these tests must be analyzed with classroom assessments and other national standardized test data to develop a clear picture of how our students are performing.

With that being said, it is also important to be aware of the factors which can have an impact on education. One of these factors can be mobility. If a child moves from school to school it can sometimes be difficult for that child to find a comfort zone and excel academically. This is not the case for every student, but there is some evidence that suggests mobility can have an impact on a child's education.

This year as we were pouring over our NeSA data, we placed an emphasis on finding out how Lakeview is doing as a school district with the students who stay within the Lakeview school system. Every year we have students moving into the Lakeview district and students moving out of the school district. Many times these students are moving in from other communities or even from other states.

In order to find out how the students who stay within the Lakeview school system are performing on the NeSA tests we began to dig into our data a little deeper. We tracked two groups of students, a group of students who were within the school system from 3rd grade to 6th grade and a group of students who were in the school system from 6th grade to 8th grade. Below are the results of our findings.

Focus group #1 -NeSA- Reading

Comparison of Scale Scores & Percent Proficient from 2010 & 2013

Students in the Lakeview system were tracked from 3rd grade to 6th grade

56 Lakeview students were tested in 6th grade in 2013 (last Spring). Of these 56 students 33 of these students were in the district when they were tested in 3rd grade. A total of 23 students had moved in or out between their 3rd grade year and their 6th grade year. The chart below shows you how these 33 students who stayed in the Lakeview system performed on the NeSA Reading test from their 3rd grade year to 6th grade year.

Focus group #2-NeSA -Reading

Students in the Lakeview system were tracked from 6th grade to 8th grade

52 Lakeview students were tested in 8th grade in 2013 (last Spring)

Of these 52 students, 32 of these students were in the district when they were in 6th grade. A total of 20 students had moved in or out between their 6th grade year and their 8th grade year.

The chart below shows you how the 32 students who stayed in the Lakeview system performed on the NeSA Reading test from their 3rd grade year to 6th grade year.

Please give us a call to update your file, so we can do our best to keep you informed of school related announcements.

Parents: You are the ones who must ultimately decide if conditions are safe for your child to travel to school during questionable weather. The school will respect your decision to keep your child home and will assist him/her in getting missed schoolwork made up.

Winning the Scholarship game

Follow these tips to increase your chances of earning scholarships:

Don't pay for scholarship searches! Use free search sites including [ScholarshipQuest](#) at [EducationQuest.org](#) where you'll find over 2,000 state and local awards. Scholarship resources are also available at your local library and at EducationQuest offices in Kearney, Lincoln and Omaha.

Visit your guidance office weekly for information about local scholarships.

Get organized. Place scholarship applications in deadline order and prioritize each award. Local and college-specific scholarships deserve top priority because you're more likely to earn them.

Continually update your activities, honors and volunteer or paid jobs using the [Activities Resume](#) at [EducationQuest.org](#).

Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exams in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.

Use quality references such as a teacher, coach or counselor. Encourage them to write specific examples of your leadership skills. Give them advance notice and a specific deadline.

Pay close attention to grammar and spelling. Ask at least two people to proofread your application.

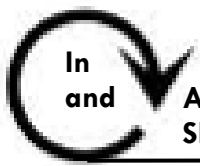

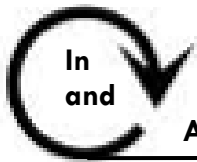
Birthday Assemblies

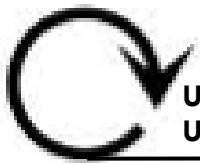
