

With the arrival of second semester some students may want to make changes to their schedule. The sooner you meet with me to discuss changes the better. To change a course a student must fill out a drop and add form which requires parental, teacher and administrative approval. This is required so that students and parents discuss the potential changes and all involved are in agreement. If you have questions involving schedule changes feel free to contact me or consult page 22 of the student handbook for details.

Before dropping and adding classes students should consider their post-high school plans. Understanding the entrance requirements of the colleges or programs being considered is extremely important. Most four year colleges recommend taking at least three years of math including Algebra I, Algebra II and Geometry. A fourth year of math may be needed depending on the field of study. Three years of science to include biology, chemistry and physics are also recommended as well as three years of social studies. All colleges require four years of English and many require two years of foreign language. If you aren't sure which classes will fit best with your plans feel free to contact me with your questions.

As a student, preparing for college is hard work and it may seem at times that a college degree or certificate may not be worth it. You don't have to look far to find data to show that the benefits of higher education are worth the work. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics http://www.bls.gov/home.htm the rate of unemployment goes down as the level of education rises. Income increases as the level of education increases with the biggest jump in income occurring between high school diploma and a completed associates degree. As the use of technology in the workplace continues most jobs will require some type of education beyond high school and the connection between education and income will be even more pronounced.

Many Lakeview students have taken or are currently taking dual credit classes. One question that inevitably comes up is "Does this class transfer?" One resource that can help answer this question is Transfer Nebraska http://transfer.nebraska.edu/. Transfer Nebraska allows you to check to see if your classes will transfer to specific institutions. The best way to be sure a dual credit class will transfer is to contact the institution in question and speak to an academic advisor. Lakeview will continue to expand its dual credit selections so understanding the transferability of courses will continue to be a topic of importance.

If you have not completed the FAFSA help for the financial aid process can be found at https://www.educationquest.org/resources/fafsa-tools/ You can also call to set up a personal, free appointment to meet with Education Quest to complete your FAFSA. The Lincoln office can be reached at 800-303-3745. Please note that I cannot help with technical issues regarding the FAFSA.


