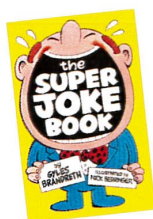


★ TRIPS TO THE LIBRARY

The Senior High Band also had great results at District Music Contest. All students participating received either a I (Superior) or II (Excellent) rating. Congratulations to everyone who participated!

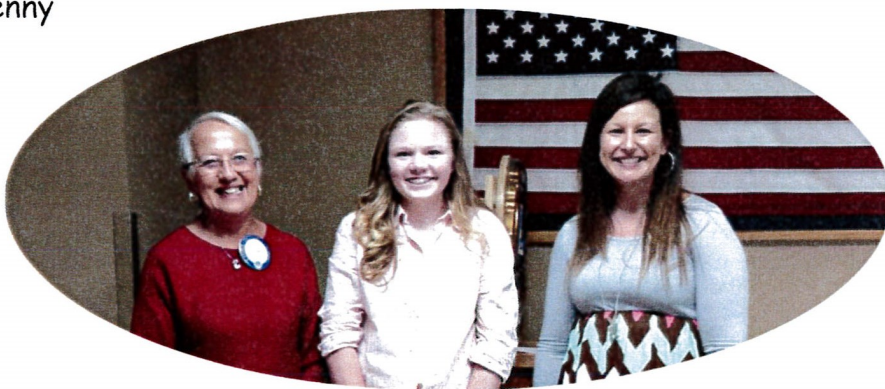

In the News...

As students have more free time on their hands this summer, I wanted to address the popular Netflix series, *13 Reasons Why*, that your child may be watching. This controversial show has been buzzing around social media in the past couple weeks. *13 Reasons Why* is based off the book written by Jay Asher. The show is based on a young lady, Hannah, who commits suicide and leaves behind a set of tapes with her reasons as to 'why' she made this decision. While this show does address important topics that are prominent among teens and adolescents today, the show does not address or offer coping methods for someone like Hannah, who may be struggling. Hannah keeps her hardships and experiences to herself and does not consult guidance or help from parents, coaches, friends, teachers, or a counselor. Continuously throughout the series, students who are struggling with the aftermath of Hannah's death continue to keep their emotions and struggles bottled up, as did Hannah.

At the end of the series, Hannah does seek help from the school guidance counselor on an act of rape that she experienced. The counselor does not offer Hannah resources, compassion or help in this situation. We want to assure parents and students that as school counselors, we will take the needed steps to listen, provide resources and do what is best for our students in every case.

Many Lakeview students may relate to this series as it is common to find a familiar emotion and connection to a TV character. Please be aware that this series comes very close to romanticizing suicide and the aftermath of suicide on parents, friends, classmates and the school. Not only does this series poorly address healthy relationships, it shows several graphic scenes related to rape and suicide. Continue to talk to your children and address the important topics they are watching in this series, along with coping skills that could have been used by Hannah and her friends. 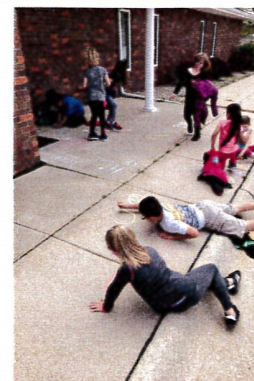

The Platte Center Second Grade Class participated in the Embryology Activity presented by Jim Mueller of the Platte County Extension Service. We

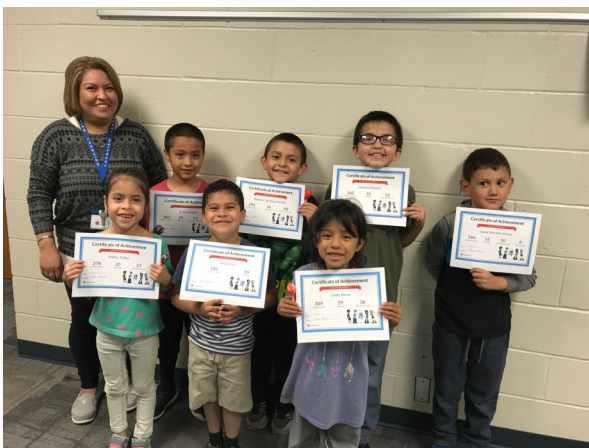

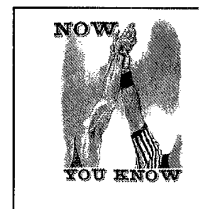
