At the end of this month I will have completed my sixth year as the superintendent of the Lakeview Community School District. As I have mentioned in past newsletters, I greatly appreciate the opportunity that has been given to me to work in the Lakeview District. This past school year has been filled with many emotional and somewhat stressful events. Through our successes, our failures and everything in between our "Lakeview Family" has been able to stay together to support each other. This is one reason while I feel that Lakeview is a special place.

COMMUNICATION

Communication is always a key to understanding and support. Sometimes we all get a little complacent in our work toward improving communication. We are also working on improving the grass areas and doing some general maintenance outside the building. We will also be doing some sidewalk replacement and getting the football game field in shape for the fall. In all buildings, the custodial crews are cleaning, waxing floors and getting ready for the next school year. Other projects could be added in the near future.

BUDGET

Over the past six years, the Board has done a good job of putting money into the depreciation fund and into the cash reserve fund. The depreciation fund can be used to replace items that are wearing out. This would include technology, carpet, textbooks and roofs to name a few allowable uses. The money in the cash reserve fund helps the district to pay its bills without borrowing money and paying more interest. The budget process for the 2015-2016 school year is currently underway and will be the focus of our work in the district office for most of July and August. As in the past, the board will make a concentrated effort to keep our tax asking as low as possible, while making sure that we continue to offer a quality education to all of our students.

FUTURE

In today's society all businesses are competitive in nature and more than ever so are school districts. If our vision for the future is to maintain quality educational programs, competitive activities and to prepare our students for the ability to be successful in the future, we must also be competitive with other educational institutions. Why study a foreign language? — Give yourself a competitive edge

You are also more likely to win the trust and friendship of people whose languages you know — even if you know them just a little.

Discover new worlds! Get an insider's view of another culture and a new view of your own. Studying a new language, reading other people's stories, and connecting with people in their own language can be a source of pleasure and surprise. Connect with other cultures. Learning about other cultures will help you expand your personal horizons and become a responsible citizen.

Your ability to talk to others and gain knowledge beyond the world of English can contribute to your community and your country. Travel is more enjoyable when you can communicate with the local people and it is very rewarding to actually use the language you have been studying to communicate with people in real world situations.

Important Information for Students Wanting to Take Dual Credit Courses

MAP- Mandatory Assessment and Placement, Central Community College implements the MAP procedures. Reminder to all high school students wanting to take a dual credit course, before you can take a dual credit course from CCC you will need to follow the <u>mandatory assessment</u> and <u>placement</u> guidelines. This means that any student wanting to take a college level course or a dual credit course at Lakeview must first take a place-

ment test and receive the appropriate score before they can enroll in a dual credit course. If a student does not meet the appropriate score the first time they can retest to try to raise their score. Any student not meeting the minimum score will not be allowed to enroll in the dual credit course, waivers are no longer accepted. If you have any questions about what you should do please contact the schools guidance office.




