GOLDEN SOWER VOTING RULES:

1. To be eligible to vote, a reader must have read or heard a minimum of **four** of the current nominees within one category: Picture Book, Chapter Book, or Novel.
2. Readers may not vote for books they have not read or heard.
3. Each reader may vote for only one (1) book. Each reader may vote from only one (1) list (Chapter book list or Novel list).
4. Voting deadline is **APRIL 15**. Votes submitted after April 15 **may not** be included in totals.

Seniors...3 must-do tasks for this fall!

1. Apply to your top college choices. If your school participates in Nebraska's *Apply2College* campaign in October, you'll get help with your college applications during a school-day event. If not, [click here](#) to find a college application checklist and other helpful resources.
2. Create an FSA ID. You and a parent must each create a username and password at fsaid.ed.gov that will serve as your Federal Student Aid (FSA) IDs for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You will each need your own email address to create an FSA ID.
3. Complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov on or after October 1. The FAFSA is your application for federal, state, and college-based financial aid. The colleges you list on the application will use that information to determine the types and amounts of financial aid they will award you.

Welcome back to the new school year! I am Mrs. Hellbusch, the Kindergarten to grade eight School Counselor.

New This Year!

This year we have a new curriculum in the K-6th grade classroom called Second Step. The Second Step Program teaches skills in the following four areas:

1. **Skills for Learning:** Students gain skills to help themselves learn, including how to focus their attention, listen carefully, use self-talk to stay on task, and be assertive when asking for help with schoolwork.
2. **Empathy:** Students learn to identify and understand their own and others' feelings. Students also learn how to take another's perspective and how to show compassion.
3. **Emotion Management:** Students learn specific skills for calming down when experiencing strong feelings, such as anxiety or anger.
4. **Problem Solving:** Students learn a process for solving problems with others in a positive way.

Your child will be learning a lot this year – and he or she will need your help!

The Great American Eclipse at Lakeview



Students and staff at all three schools had fun participating in a number of activities on August 21st for the solar



eclipse. All students and staff were provided with solar safety glasses and training on how to use them. Starting at 11:30, students went outside in small groups with their teachers to observe the eclipse. At 12:50, all students went outside together for 15 minutes to view the maximum eclipse of 99%. Students in different classes also made pin hole box viewers, solar ovens and a scale model of the sun and planets. Some classes also watched a live stream of the total solar eclipse online as the moon's shadow passed over other locations in the U.S.



Three buses set out on Monday morning for Central City for the opportunity to be in the path of totality and view the total solar eclipse. Mrs. Miller, Mr. Haschke, Mr. Bargen, Mrs. Helms and Mr. Helms took a group of 7-12th graders to the football field at Central City High School where they joined up with students from five other schools for the event. Lakeview students participated in activities to learn about the eclipse



and got the opportunity to look at the sun through a telescope with a special solar filter with Dr. Young from Wayne State College during the morning and early afternoon. The 9-12 grade students also served as student helpers and were instrumental in helping the event run smoothly. Thankfully, the forecast of mostly cloudy conditions was wrong and we enjoyed almost two minutes of a beautiful view of totality.



We would like to thank the Lakeview Boosters for supporting our efforts and Central City Public Schools for hosting the viewing event. Our students and staff will remember this opportunity for years to come.

Lakeview Continues as a Certified Microsoft IT Academy

In the spring of 2014, the Nebraska State Legislature appropriated \$250,000 in funds to support the implementation of Microsoft Information Technology Academies in Nebraska high schools and community colleges. At that time, Lakeview High School was selected and continues to be a Certified Microsoft IT Academy and Certiport Testing Center. Funds were appropriated for three school years. Over the past three years, over 200 Lakeview students have received their certifications.

Unfortunately, the funding for this year was cut by the legislature. It is the hope that this funding will continue once the agriculture economy becomes more stable. Until that time, the administration has approved funding for this year so that Lakeview students can continue to be a part of this fantastic opportunity.

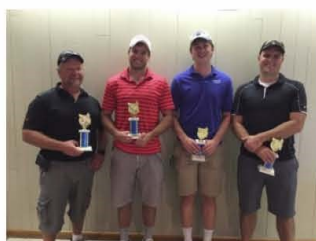
