School Cancellation Information – December 2017

Making decisions regarding snow days is never fun or easy. If you don't believe me, spend some time watching all of the names superintendents get called on social media during a storm. These tough decisions will inevitably make some mad because they think we should be called off while others can't believe how 'soft' schools have become with their decisions. I can promise we will do the best we can with the information and resources we have at the time. Please remember, you can keep your child(ren) home on days that we have school but you think we shouldn't.

We have one of the most unique set-ups of any school district in the state of Nebraska. Our district covers an incredible amount of land. We can have one section of the district completely covered in snow while the other only gets a dusting. This creates tough scenarios as we try to do what is best for our students. This HAS OFTEN resulted in Lakeview not having school while Columbus Public and Columbus Scotus are in session. In addition, Mid-States School Bus Inc. has the ability to plug in their buses at night which keeps them from freezing during those cold winter nights and early morning. With that said, we will not often call school due to 'cold days' like many districts are forced into because their buses won't start. Again, if you think we shouldn't have school on a 'cold day' where other districts have shut down, please feel free to keep your child(ren) at home.

If we have a tough winter with several cancellations, we will forced to make up some students days on May 18th, May 21st, May 22nd, and so on. We are hoping to end school as scheduled but we are restricted by state mandates on the number of instructional hours we provide to our students. Any changes to the school calendar will be communicated early and often!

We take the safety of our students and staff very seriously. We will make what we feel is the best decision for the school district as a whole during these difficult scenarios. Please feel free to contact me with any questions, comments, or concerns.

New College Timeline will keep you on track to college

EducationQuest has launched a new <u>College Timeline</u> for students in grades 9-12 that spells out steps you should take during fall, winter, spring, and summer to plan for college.

The Timeline also allows you to add your own tasks, get reminders when it's time to complete tasks, and check off tasks when they're complete. You can access these features by creating and/or logging into your MyEducationQuest account at EducationQuest.org.

Check it out and give it a try. It will make the college planning process more manageable!

What to expect after you submit your FAFSA

The <u>FAFSA</u> opened October 1 so many of you have already completed and submitted your form. Here's what happens next:

Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR). You'll receive it via an email link if you provided an email address on your FAFSA. The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received, and if you need to take further action to process your FAFSA.

Make sure you applied for admission to colleges you listed on your FAFSA.

Colleges who receive your FAFSA results typically won't send you a financial aid package until you've applied and have been accepted to the school.

Watch for verification requests. The college(s) you listed on your FAFSA might request verification of your FAFSA information. If so, send the required documents to the colleges' financial aid office.

Watch for financial aid award notifications. The colleges you applied to – and listed on your FAFSA – will send you a financial aid award notification detailing the types and amounts of aid they're offering based on your financial need.

Haven't completed your FAFSA yet?

No problem! You and a parent can complete the form at <u>FAFSA.gov</u>. Before you start, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>. You'll need them to access and sign the FAFSA.

Winning the scholarship game

Follow these tips to increase your chances of earning scholarships:

Don't ever pay for scholarship searches! Use *free* resources such as <u>ScholarshipQuest</u> at EducationQuest.org with over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. Free national sites include <u>Peterson's</u>, <u>FindTuition</u>, <u>Cappex</u>, and <u>Chegg</u>.

Visit your school counselor often for information about local scholarships.

Focus on local and college-specific scholarships because you're more likely to earn them.

Update your activities, honors, community service or paid jobs using the <u>Activities Resume</u> at EducationQuest.org.

Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exam in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.

Use quality references such as a teacher, coach or counselor. Encourage them to write specific examples of your leadership skills. Give them advance notice and a specific deadline.

Tailor your essay to the scholarship. Ask an English teacher to read your essay and offer advice on making a big impact. Your essay will need to stand out from other applications.

Reading Challenges

Please encourage your student to participate in the reading challenges and read, read! Check in regularly to ask about their progress towards their AR and reading goals.

PLATTE CENTER-SUPERHEROES



Platte Center Elementary students are once again participating in a SUPER Accelerated Reader challenge this school year with a theme of "Superheroes". The goal is to encourage students to be excited about reading and stay motivated to read both inside and outside the classroom.

Each semester, students that reach their grade level goal will be invited to participate in a reward event to celebrate their successful reading. Students must meet their points goal, an accuracy average of 80% and

maintain the average book reading level set by their classroom teacher. If students meet both semester goals, they will also receive a gold medal. Additionally, there are fun other rewards for students earning grade-level assigned points!

Shell Creek-WINTER OLYMPICS

Every month Shell Creek students who have read the most words in each class are recognized at Mr. Graves's school-wide assembly. These readers receive a gold medal to place on their classroom desks and a certificate for the month.

At the end of each quarter all students who have made their AR goal attend an activity and receive a treat from Mr. Graves. The first quarter we made olympic torches and put them on our lockers. We will make other olympic magnets for 2nd and 3rd quarters. For the fourth quarter we will have an extra recess and treats.

Also, Shell Creek readers have the opportunity to be placed on the million words (or half a million words) on the wall of fame. Students will be eligible to count the words from books for which they have taken (and passed) an AR test.

JUNIOR HIGH-DUNK TANK



Both individual and group achievements are recognized at the junior high level. Number of pages for every book read (and with a 70%+ on the AR Test) will be calculated for each student.

Each JH Team time group will compete against each other to see who can read the most pages during each quarter. The winning team wins a pizza party for that quarter.

Students that read more than 800 pages in a quarter receives a coupon for a free a la carte item. Readers of 3,500 or more pages

by May 11th will receive a reading medallion. Lastly, the top readers in both 7th and 8th grade will get a chance to dunk students' chosen teacher in the dunk tank at the Reading Challenge Celebration at the end of the school year!



VEGETABLES Vegetables

A variety of vegetables helps kids get the nutrients and fiber they need for good health.

MILK

Low-fat (1%)

or Fat-free milk. Children and teens need the calcium, protein, and vitamin D found in milk for strong bones, teeth and muscles.

GRAINS

Whole grains give kids B vitamins, minerals, and fiber to help them feel fuller longer so they stay alert to concentrate at school.

PROTEIN FOODS

Meat, poultry, fish, dry beans, peas, eggs, nuts, and seeds provide many nutrients including protein and iron. Portion sizes are based upon the nutrition needs of children in various grade groups. School meals also allow cheese, tofu, and yogurt to count as the meat/meat alternate in the school lunch.

FRUITS

Every school lunch includes fruits as well as vegetables. Only 1/2 of the fruits offered may be 100% juice, since whole and cut-up fruits have more fiber.
