Wrapping up your senior year

Seniors...stay on track to college by completing these second-semester tasks:

Complete the financial aid process. By now, you should have filed your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). If you haven't, apply at fafsa.gov.

Compare financial aid award notifications. The colleges you listed on your FAFSA will send you notifications detailing the financial aid they're offering. Compare the notifications to determine which school provides the best package.

Watch your grades. If you slack off and get poor grades, your college admission could be revoked.

Apply for scholarships. See ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org to find Nebraska-based scholarships and a list of national scholarship sites.

Make your final college selection. Notify the other colleges so they can take you off their mailing list.

Be aware of deadlines to accept financial aid and college admission offers, submit your housing deposit, and register for new-student orientation.

Juniors...it's time to narrow your college choices.

Narrow your college choices soon to prepare for these upcoming activities:

ACT college entrance exam. When you take the exam this spring, you'll be asked to provide a list of colleges that should receive your score.

Completion of the <u>FAFSA</u> early next fall. You and your parents can complete the FAFSA beginning October 1 of your senior year. The colleges you list on the form will receive the results.

Apply2College Campaign. Early next fall, it will be time to apply to your top college choices. Many high schools will participate in the Apply2College campaign. during which seniors get help during the school day with college applications.

Campus visits will help you narrow your choices

Your spring break is a perfect time to visit schools that interest you. Schedule your visits at least two weeks in advance and be prepared with <u>questions</u> to ask. Find more tips in the <u>"Selecting a College" section</u> at **EducationQuest.org**.

Scholarships

Seniors, it's scholarship season! Here are different ways to access information regarding scholarships opportunities.

- 1.Email: check your email for new scholarships that are coming through the counseling office.
- 2. Mrs. Rambour's Counseling Website: bit.ly/lvcounselor or https://sites.google.com/lakeview.esu7.org/counselingcenter
- 3. ScholarshipQuest: ScholarshipQuest posts over 2000 Nebraska based scholarships for students. All Lakeview seniors have a ScholarshipQuest account.
- 4. College Websites: Check your college's website for college specific scholarship.

It is very important that you note any scholarship deadlines.

If you need help finding any scholarship information, please see me.

Registration

Class registration for the 2018-2019 school year is soon approaching. I will be visiting with all students about graduation requirements and the required courses for their upcoming school year. Students will then be coming home with a registration form to be signed by a parent or guardian listing the classes that they wish to take for the upcoming school year. Required courses will be listed on the top. Please see the following document on Lakeview's Graduation Requirements. To meet credit requirements students should earn at least 60 credit hours each school year to reach a total of 240 credit hours. If you have any questions regarding the courses that you child should be taking next year, please email or call. Lakeview also offers several dual credit courses along with internship opportunities for students to include in their class schedule.

Dual Credit Courses:

Students need to be aware that their course selections in high school will either enhance their post high school opportunities or limit them. Each post high school option has its own admission requirements. Each student is expected to be pro-active in planning to meet those requirements for the post high school option of their choice. Students have the option to earn college credit while in high school. Students planning on attending college after high school may choose to take advantage of the different options that Lakeview offers. Tuition and admissions testing are the responsibility of the student however the school counseling department will gladly assist in preparing for college credit courses.

Online and Onsite College Classes – Students who are on track to graduate and have permission from the administration may enroll in online/onsite classes at the various community colleges. Students who qualify may be given a period during the school day to work on their college class. Students may also take onsite college courses at Central Community College if scheduling permits. Students are responsible for paying for tuition and books for these classes. Students typically do not earn high school credit from Lakeview High School for these classes. It is highly recommended that students check with the technical school, college, or university they plan to attend to ensure that credits will transfer.

Dual Credit – Dual credit classes offer the students the opportunity to earn high school and college credits at the same time. Our current offerings are College Algebra, General Biology, College English and Public Speaking which are all offered through CCC. Lakeview also offers Calculus through Nebraska Wesleyan. It is highly recommended that students check with the technical school, college, or university they plan to attend to ensure that credits will transfer. Students are responsible for tuition for the college credits, but Lakeview provides the books.

Social Science semester elective

All students in Grades 9-11 are required to take a minimum of six classes. Year-long classes are those which cannot be entered second semester without having completed first semester. Seniors are required to be enrolled for a minimum of 20 credits per semester.

Students must have successfully completed a minimum of 30 science credits to graduate from Lakeview High School.

........... 10 additional credits selected from the following:

Chemistry, Physics, Physiology, Science Research, Principles of Technology, Horticulture, Animal Science, Integrated Science, General

Biology or an approved college or correspondence course.

Exceptions to this must be approved by the Principal.


In & Around Christ Lutheran School...






