Dear Parent/Guardian:

Many school districts around the nation and in Nebraska have seen an increased number of threats of violence since the tragic events at Stoneman Douglas High School in Florida earlier in the month. Unfortunately, Lakeview Community Schools is not immune to these issues. But with our recent incident along with the many others happening in neighboring Nebraska school districts, both LCS and the Sheriff's Office thought this was an appropriate time to send out a joint letter assuring all parents that both the school district and Sheriff's Office take all threats seriously.

Student safety shall always be a top priority for our district and we have many procedures and systems in place including but not limited to locked doors, buzzer entry systems, quarterly district safety meetings, school safety trainings, annual walkthroughs with local law enforcement, and random safety sweeps. We have an excellent working relationship with the Platte County Sheriff's Office and they have remained committed to assisting LCS in providing a safe environment for your children.

As parents/guardians you play a critical role in communicating and reinforcing school safety procedures with your children, including checking phones, social media, and other communication devices. In addition, reinforce with your children that if they see something that does not look right or hear something that does not sound right, please tell a trusted adult at the school or home. If you see something – say something! Lastly, now is a great time to have a conversation with your child that all threats, even idle threats, are not to be made under any circumstances. All instances will be taken seriously and the Sheriff's Office will respond accordingly, which may result in consequences not only at the school but with the court system.

The safety of our students is and will continue to be a top priority, and we appreciate your support.
