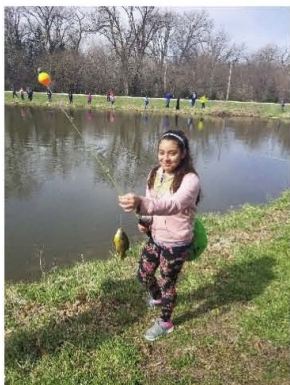
Wear Blue for Child Abuse Awareness

Students were able to enjoy swimming, bounces houses, racquetball, dodge ball, and different games in the gym. Thanks to everyone who volunteered to make this day a success!



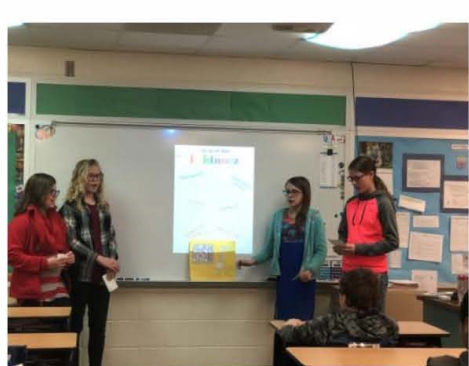
