From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS CURRICULUM ADOPTION

Throughout the last 12 months, Lakeview Community Schools has undertaken an English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum adoption process for K-9th grades. This is one of the most important practices that a school district takes on because of the importance of literacy on a child's education. If a student struggles to read and write, they will fall behind in almost all academic disciplines. Lakeview has done a lot of due diligence to ensure our ELA curriculum will be viable and current with best educational practices. We have included all elementary teachers, junior high English teacher, high school English teachers, administrators, parents, educational service unit professionals, and the Board of Education. Lakeview began with almost a dozen different options and reduced down to a final two using input from this group with both in-person meetings and feedback from a survey which was sent to all parents and staff members last spring. Once these final options were identified, a team of teachers visited schools that are currently using both curriculums to see them in action. Once these measures were taken they reported back to the entire group for a decision to be made. In the coming months, a final recommendation will be made to the Board of Education on a new K-9 ELA curriculum that will ensure Lakeview students are being set up for academic success for the years to come. As with any change to a curriculum, there will be bumps in the road, but we are confident our new ELA curriculum will push our students forward and produce excellent results in future years.

EARLY DISMISSALS AND PLC'S

The second and fourth Wednesday of each month are early dismissals throughout the district for our teachers to engage in our Professional Learning Communities (PLC's). PLC's are a systematic process in which teachers work together to analyze and improve their classroom practice. Teachers work in collaborative teams, engaging in discussions in which they share expertise and work collaboratively to improve teaching skills and the academic performance of students. These meetings help to make sure we have a great district-wide curriculum at the elementary grade levels, expanded learning within each department at the junior/senior high levels, excellent transitions in curriculum between grade levels and buildings, and advancements within our curriculum so we continue to improve instead of staying stagnant. In addition, this time can be used to push forward district-wide initiatives such as school safety/security, curriculum adoption, etc.

We know these early dismissals can create some hard aches for families as they create the need to schedule daycare, create odd time pick-up times, and create irregularity within the normal schedule. We are definitely sympathetic to these issues and want you to know these early outs are not done lightly or without reason. We feel as though the educational outcomes of our students improve dramatically by allowing the PLC's to take place. We appreciate everyone making the sacrifices on the early out days to allow this professional development to take place to ensure we make Lakeview as great of a district as possible!
