#### Induction



#### Speech Team Again Wins State-Runner Up

On March 21<sup>st</sup>, the Lakeview Speech Team completed another successful season by placing as the Class B runner-up at the NSAA State Speech Championships in Kearney. It is the third consecutive year the program has accomplished this feat.


Earning points for the team were Seniors Madison Schwarz and Britney Kouma along with Junior Ethan Goldfish Vinson and Sophomore Dylan Jensen. Schwarz and Vinson placed third in duet acting, while Vinson finished as runner-up in persuasive speaking. Kouma placed third in serious interpretation. Jensen finished as runner-up in informative speaking, a result that also qualified him for this years' national tournament (the other medalists were already qualified). With these finishes, the group earned 68 points, enough to put the team in an unbreakable tie with Aurora, who shared the runner-up title. York finished as the Class B champion with 126 points.

The finish was the culmination of one of the program's most successful seasons, which including winning its district for the fourth consecutive year, and winning three of nine invitationals. The team is next in action May 10-12, when Slayde Bittner, Emily Cunningham, Andrew Herley, Britney Kouma, Madison Mahoney, Halla Paschold, Ethan Goldfish Vinson, Emily Stevenson, and Dylan Jensen compete at National Individual Event Tournament of Champions at Millard North High School in Omaha, NE.



As part of the 4-H Embryology School Enrichment program 2<sup>nd</sup> graders had the opportunity to incubate, candle, and watch eggs hatch through the Nebraska

Extension. Students learned chickens hatch in 21 days and need to be in an environment that is 100 degrees
Fahrenheit. Each day, three times a day students turned the eggs to help the embryos exercise, and then at night and on weekends we plugged a "turner" in. After 14 days Ms.
Aliesha came back to candle our eggs. Using light we saw the embryos in the shell and could tell if they were "winners"



(growing), "quitters" (stopped growing), or "yolkers" (not fertile).

Our eggs started hatching on a Monday, and then on Thursday they all went home with one student that had permission from their parents.
