

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## **Fall Business Tours**

Thirty-seven Lakeview FBLA went to Norfolk, Nebraska and helped out Orphan Grain Train and Mercy Meals. Both of these organizations are non-profit. Mercy Meals makes and packages meals for people living in poverty. Each meal costs less than a dollar to make and it feeds a family a six. Lakeview FBLA packaged enough meals to feed 6900 people and gave a \$25 donation. Orphan Grain Train packages clothes, shoes, and bikes and sends them to people in third world countries that do not have any. The chapter spent the morning sorting and packaging items, as well as, gave a \$25 donation. After Orphan Grain Train and Mercy Meals, Lakeview FBLA went to Monroe, Nebraska to Horn T Zoo. The owner told the group about how he worked hard and built his dream from nothing. All of the animals in Horn T Zoo were from the owner's private collection, but he wanted to show them off so he created the zoo.

## **Fall Leadership Conference (FLC)**

On September 24th, the officer team went to Hastings College for their Fall Leadership Conference. They listened to the band Gooding and went to a workshop for their position. Afterward, the officers went to two fundamental workshops of their choosing. The officers learned more about their duties as an officer, opportunities in FBLA, and leadership skills to help them as they serve their term as a Lakeview FBLA officer.

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### Seniors...a reminder of what to do this fall

There's A LOT going on right now with the financial aid and college admission processes, but don't get overwhelmed! Here's a recap of tasks you should complete this fall to stay on track to college.

#### Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- First, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at [fsaid.ed.gov](https://fsaid.ed.gov). You'll need it to access and sign the FAFSA. [Click here](#) for instructions.
- Review our [FAFSA Checklist](#) for a list of items to gather before you start the form.
- Complete the FAFSA at [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov). You may also complete it via the myStudentAid app for iOS and Android.

#### Apply to your top college choices




## 3rd Grade Field Trip

Thank you to all of the parents who took the day to come along, lead small groups and spend time with all the Shell Creek children. The support we get from the parents at Shell Creek is second to none!

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
On October 2, Cornhusker Public Power came to share with the 5th graders the importance of power safety. Students learned about the difference between insulators and conductors and what some of them look like on power poles. They also demonstrated many electrical mistakes that happen in and around neighborhoods and homes. Jay Wemhoff even climbed a telephone pole outside the school for us, after showing us the different parts of their work gear they wear. Thanks for coming out Cornhusker Public Power! Our students are now much more knowledgeable and can help their families be safer around electricity and power units!




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6th grade is off to a great start! The students have finally settled into their daily routines and are working really hard to close out a strong first quarter of the year. In Mr. Ahlers's reading, we end each quarter with a novel study. We are currently reading Hatchet by Gary Paulsen. The students are absolutely loving the suspenseful story of a boy who has to learn to survive alone in the wild. If you see a sixth grader, ask them what their favorite part is so far!

There are lots of new faces in the EL Program at Shell Creek this year!! Our newcomers have been practicing how to use simple school nouns in sentences, acting out action verbs, identifying parts of our body, and clothing words. Their reading skills have also taken off and they love playing with word and picture cards! We also have some competitive students who love learning by playing games!



### Reading Disability- Dyslexia

Why is reading important? This is a question that most students and their parents will ask themselves at least once throughout their academic careers. Most children start learning to read by connecting how speech sounds and makes up words. They then connect these sounds to the letters of the alphabet. But what if when you were reading you see that the word are not spaced correctly? Or that sometimes all the letters are pushed together? And you spell words like 'xatle az tha snd'?

There are many types of reading disabilities, but the most common is Word Level Recognition Disability, otherwise known as Dyslexia. Dyslexia can be difficult to spot in children before they enter school. Although, these signs may be apparent it does not mean the child will have dyslexia. A few symptoms can be:

- Delayed speech
- Difficulty mastering tying shoes
- Confuse right and left/ over and under/before and after \*directionality words
- Late establishing dominant hand
- Difficulty completing phonemic awareness tasks
- Difficulty rhyming
- Difficulty writing alphabet in order
- Reading a word on one page, but not correctly on a next
- Slow, labored, and inaccurate reading of single words in isolation
- Misreading a word that has the same first and last letter and the same shape (form-from, trail-trial- could-cold- star-stair, how-who, saw-was)
- Difficulty spelling

Although, these signs may be apparent it does not mean the child will have dyslexia.

Even though dyslexia is a life-long disorder, there are many different strategies that can be used such as, phonics, multisensory approaches and helpful tips and tricks. If you ever feel as though your child is struggling more than their peers. Always feel comfortable contacting your child's teacher. Early intervention is the best way to help.

Some of the vehicles first graders experienced were an ambulance, fire truck, police cars, an electric car, a limousine, and a semi.


It was a great way to study our community and the vehicles that operate in and around our area.




4H Ozbots-- On October 10 & 11, 3rd Graders learned about and programmed robots from the 4H extension office.




