From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

Last month there were a couple of significant events that will reshape Lakeview in the future. The first was the approval for the implementation of Lakeview Preschool located at Platte Center Elementary. The plan is for the preschool to have both a morning and afternoon session with up to 30 students total throughout the day. This decision was made after months of conversation on the best way to begin a preschool in our geographically spread out district. Because Platte Center Elementary had the space available in the modular behind the school for the preschool to be located, it was the best option to get this additional programming moving forward. We surveyed Lakeview parents/patrons in September of 2018. We received overwhelming support for the opening of a preschool facility, with 88% of parents with preschool students recommending us to move forward. While we are still figuring out the final logistics of this new offering, we do know that the applications will be available starting on January 6th, 2020. The deadline for these applications will be on March 6th, 2020. If you are interested in attending Lakeview Preschool at Platte Center Elementary, please be sure to get your application turned in prior to the deadline. The significant second event that happened on October 15th was the passing of a bond issue for the renovations and additions to the Lakeview Jr./Sr. High School. The passing of this bond will help Lakeview move forward with many needed changes in that building, including improved safety, ADA compliance, air quality improvements, and additional space for our growing student population. The district tried to be open and transparent throughout the process to ensure the voters knew what was being proposed and why it was a need for our district. Now that it has passed, we begin the next phases of the process, including final design, surveys, soil testing, and development of bid packages. While we would like to see construction workers on-site immediately getting started, that will probably not happen until March or April as we must get past the final design phase to begin construction. We intend to have the building completed by the beginning of the 2021-22 school year! We appreciate your flexibility and understanding over the next 20 months as we know there will be several last-minute changes, inconveniences, and issues to work through as the building takes an entirely new form. What I can promise is that the short-term inconveniences this project brings on will be worth it as Lakeview Jr./Sr. High School's learning environment will dramatically improve when it is all completed!

I am so excited about the future of Lakeview Community Schools! These changes for our district will only continue to improve the excellent education provided to the students. Go Vikings!

What to expect after you submit your FAFSA

The [FAFSA](#) opened October 1, so many of you have already completed and submitted your form. Here's what happens next:

Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR). You'll receive it via an email link if you provided an email address on your FAFSA. The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and lets you know if you need to take further action to process your FAFSA.

Make sure you applied for admission to colleges you listed on your FAFSA. Colleges that receive your FAFSA results typically won't send you a financial aid package until you've applied and have been accepted to the school.

Watch for verification requests. The college(s) you listed on your FAFSA might request verification of your FAFSA information. If so, send the required documents to the colleges' financial aid office.

Watch for financial aid award notifications. The colleges you were accepted to – and listed on your FAFSA – will send you financial aid award notifications detailing the types and amounts of aid they're offering based on your financial need.

No problem! You and a parent can complete the form at [FAFSA.gov](#). Before you start, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at [fsaid.ed.gov](#). You'll need them to access and sign the form.

Don't ever pay for scholarship searches! Use *free* resources such as [ScholarshipQuest](#) at EducationQuest.org with over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships, or free national sites like [Cappex](#), [GoodCall](#), and [Chegg](#).

Visit your school counselor often for information about local scholarships.

Focus on local and college-specific scholarships because you're more likely to earn them.

Update your activities, honors, community service or paid jobs using the [Activities Resume](#) at EducationQuest.org.

Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exam(s) in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.

Use quality references such as a teacher, coach, or counselor. Encourage them to write specific examples of your leadership skills. Give them a specific deadline, and a copy of your Activities Resume.

Tailor your essay to the scholarship. Ask an English teacher to read your essay and offer advice on making a big impact. Your essay will need to stand out from other applications.

Coaches will take the team into Columbus and sell our coupon booklets. Pizza will be served when they return to the weight room.

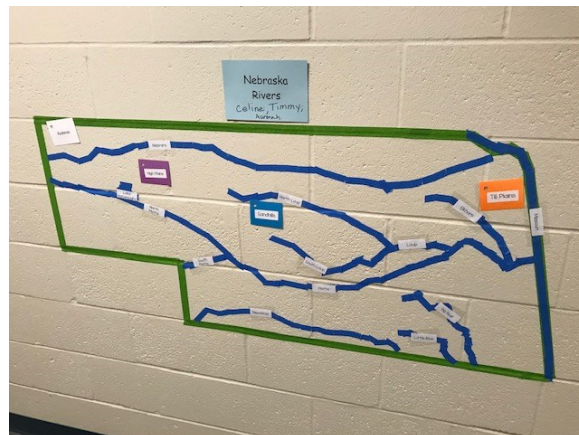

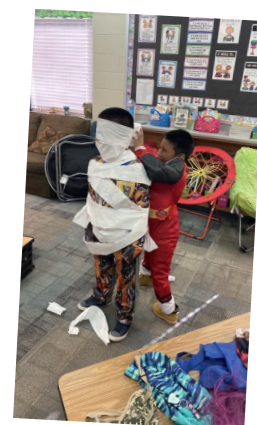
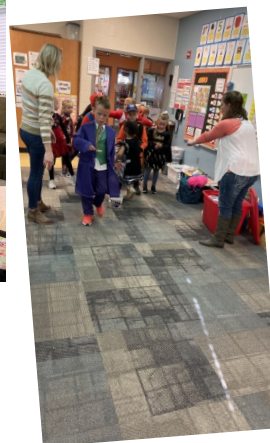

Circle of Friends

Are you familiar with Circle of Friends? Circle of Friends (COF) provides the opportunity for students with autism to build genuine friendships with peers who do not have autism. Nationwide, COF establishes a social inclusion program on school campuses that increases the understanding, acceptance and appreciation of differences while decreasing bullying and creating a safer school environment.

Circle of Friends is a form of Peer Mediated Intervention. Through a Circle of Friends program, typically developing peers are taught important information about classmates with social challenges, and are encouraged to befriend them. These peer mentors are provided education and awareness, strategies for connecting and supporting others who may be different, and given opportunities to socially interact on a regular basis. Research indicates COF programs can increase the quality of social interactions for children with autism, prevent bullying, develop empathy and caring in peers, decrease office behavioral referrals and increase academic classroom participation.

Circle of Friends started in our district at Shell Creek 6 years ago when Carol Downs (Resource Teacher) and Nancy Briggs (Speech-Language Pathologist) applied for a grant, were accepted and attended training. Since that time, Lakeview Jr./Sr. High and Platte Center have also started groups. Some of the peer mentors and target students from the original group 6 years ago are still involved in COF today. Circle of Friends has been a great asset to Lakeview Community Schools!

On Friday, November 1 the Fifth Grade students went to the Aurora Edgerton Science Museum. Students were able to have access to many hands on experiments to learn more about different science materials. Students also attended three different sessions where they learned more about motion, sound waves, and chemical reactions. This allowed students to build on ideas that we have been learning about in the classroom or will be learning about in the future. Thank you to the parents that were able to attend with us! It was a great day!

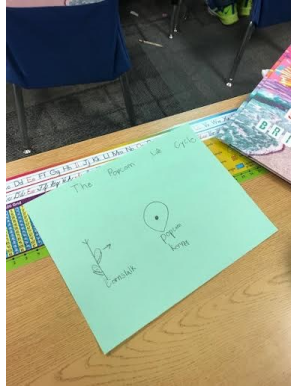

Black Bean Hummus Article for December

Snack Attack!

Everyone loves tasty, healthy snacks, and here at Lakeview's kitchen we are dishing up Black Bean Hummus. Black Beans aide in digestion, build healthy bones, and decreases blood pressure. Never tried hummus before? Hummus can be used as a spread on a bread or a dip for crackers and vegetables. Follow our recipe below to taste this flavorful snack.



Black Bean Hummus



Ingredients

3 cups cooked black beans (about 2 cans, drained and rinsed)
1 small onion, diced
1/2 green pepper, diced
3 cloves garlic, minced
2 T ground cumin
1 1/2 T olive oil
2 T chopped fresh cilantro
1/4 c vegetable broth

Directions

Drain and rinse black beans if using canned.
Place olive oil in skillet set over medium-high heat. Add onions, peppers, and garlic and saute about three minutes, until vegetables are fragrant and starting to brown slightly. Add cumin, stir well, reduce heat to medium and cook another two minutes.
Place beans in food processor and pulse several times. Add vegetable mixture and pulse a few more times. Add vegetable broth in small batches to thin the dip to the desired consistency. Garnish with chopped cilantro. Serve immediately or store in refrigerator for up to 10 days.

Makes 16 1/4-cup servings!

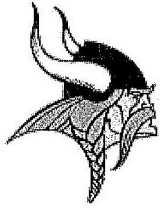
