## From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas School Cancellation Information – December 2019

  - Please ensure you have your current phone number(s) on file at the school to guarantee you receive all communication.

Making decisions regarding snow days is never fun or easy. If you don't believe me, spend some time watching all of the names superintendents get called on social media during a storm. These tough decisions will inevitably make some mad because they think we should be called off while others can't believe how 'soft' schools have become with their decisions. I can promise we will do the best we can with the information and resources we have at the time. Please remember, you can keep your child(ren) home on days that we have school but you think we shouldn't.

We have one of the most unique set-ups of any school district in the state of Nebraska. First, our district covers an incredible amount of land. We can have one section of the district completely covered in snow while the other only gets a dusting. This creates tough scenarios as we try to do what is best for our students. This HAS OFTEN resulted in Lakeview not having school while Columbus Public and Columbus Scotus are in session. In addition, Mid-States School Bus Inc. has the ability to plug in their buses at night which keeps them from freezing during those cold winter nights and early morning. With that said, we will not often call school due to 'cold days' like many districts are forced into because their buses won't start. Again, if you think we shouldn't have school on a 'cold day' where other districts have shut down, please feel free to keep your child(ren) at home.

If we have a tough winter with several cancellations, we may be forced to make up some student days on May 22<sup>nd</sup>, May 26<sup>th</sup>, May 27<sup>th</sup>, and so on. We are hoping to end school as scheduled but we are restricted by state mandates on the number of instructional hours we provide to our students. Any changes to the school calendar will be communicated early and often!

We take the safety of our students and staff very seriously. We will make what we feel is the best decision for the school district as a whole during these difficult scenarios. Please feel free to contact me with any questions, comments, or concerns.

## Lunch Crew

This month's taste testing was fruit smoothies. Fruits are full of healthy nutrients, such as Vitamin C, Fiber, Potassium and Folate. #### 2020-21 Mini-Grant Application Topics

- Read Naturally Live—a web-based intervention efficiently applies research-based Read Naturally Strategy to accelerate reading achievement. Visual and auditory prompts guide students through steps to develop fluency, support comprehension, and improve vocabulary.
- ECR4Kids--The Surf Portable Lap Desk—During group work, students will be able to use portable lap desks.

  These lap desks can be used as alternative seating to accommodate drawing, writing and independent work.

  Lap desks can be utilized for many succeeding years.
- Mystery Science—A hands-on NGSS-aligned science curriculum with ready lessons for teachers. Each lesson begins with a mystery allowing students to explore these mysteries through discussions, videos, and hands-on activities/experiments.
- Kindle Fire 7's—These units would create a classroom that is one-on-one and would allow students to access technology several times a day, every day. Teachers would be able to differentiate instructions and assign tasks which are ability level appropriate.
- Small Engine/Technology Tool Upgrade—With the addition of a program in these areas comes the need for specialized tools. These tools are rapidly becoming standard place in a technician's toolbox.
- E4 CNC Router Kit—This router will be utilized for both the Principles of Technology Class and the robotics program. The router will be used to teach 2D modeling and supplement the 3D modeling in conjunction with the 3D printer.
- EVO Classroom Kit—Implementing 12 Bots into the classroom will assist students as they learn "coding" (communicating with computers). Coding skills will also help the students improve their ability to problem solve, become more creative, persistent, collaborative, and better communicators.
