







From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

There is a popular image that circulates social media that says, "Breaking someone's trust is like crumpling a piece of paper. You can smooth it over, but it's never going to be the same again." This image perfectly illustrates the issues that echo throughout the Nebraska legislative chambers each yearly session. This famous image further shows the profound lack of trust between our governing body and the Nebraska public educations system.

Education is the most significant investment we as a state make in our future. Research shows that the public education system decreases unemployment, incarceration rates, and reliance on public programs. In addition, education research has shown it dramatically improves our economy and long term health. It is hard to argue these are items that are not only positive for the individual but benefit our society as a whole. But yet, year-after-year, it is a constant struggle to get the Nebraska Legislature to put any additional resources into education. Instead, it often is a tussle to keep funding public education and ward off further cuts.

Nebraska schools had an average annual spending increase of 3.5% from 2003-2014. During this same time, the number of students educated in Nebraska increased by 8.16%, and the number of students living in poverty increased almost 10%. While this growth was happening, the percentage of our state budget allocated for K-12 education decreased from 32% to 27.6% over the last 17 years, reducing the funds being distributed to schools by an estimated \$187 million. This lack of investment is well documented with the constant publicizing of Nebraska ranking 49th in the country for state assistance to public education. These lack of state support statistics mirror the inverse in high property taxes collected, which rank 7th nationally. These statistics being the exact opposite of each other is not a coincidence!

There are plenty of people wanting this session to result in additional funding for public education that results in a reduction of property taxes. The school community wants this to happen as well! Several proposals are being thrown around as possibilities to make this a reality including educational foundation aid, basic funding allowances, and increases to the property tax credit fund. At the end of the day, you can only move at the speed of trust. And that trust has been dramatically fractured over the past several years. It will be imperative that education groups and state senators find a way this session to "smooth the crumpled paper." Our kids are depending on us!

Dyscalculia

Dyscalculia is a condition that affects the ability to acquire arithmetical skills. Dyscalculic learner may have difficulty understanding simple number concepts, lack an intuitive grasp of numbers, and have problems learning number facts and procedures, even if they produce a correct answer or use a correct method, they may do so mechanically and without confidence. A dyscalculia learner stands out as having no 'feel for numbers' at all, no ability to estimate even small quantities, and no idea whether an answer to an arithmetic problem is reasonable or not. Some indicators for dyscalculia include: an inability to subitise (see without counting) even very small quantities, an inability to estimate whether a numerical answer is reasonable, weaknesses in both short-term and long-term memory, an inability to count backwards reliably, a weakness in visual and spatial orientation, directional (left/right) confusion, slow processing speeds when engaged in math activities, trouble with sequencing, a tendency not to notice patterns, a problem with all aspects of money, a marked delay in learning to read a clock to tell the time, an inability to manage time in daily life.

School Wide - Gratitude November - focus on what is gratitude, the importance of showing gratitude and how reflecting on gratitude improves our lives.

Kindness December and January - we are focusing on how our acts of kindness impact others.

Using the Zones of Regulation at Home

While it's not mandatory to use this program at home, children may become very interested in using this inside and outside of school. The Zones of Regulation - written and created by Leah M. Kuypers, MA Ed OTR/L contains lessons we completed along with the language we provide the students with. The Zones of Regulation contains four categories of emotions, Green, Red, Yellow, and Blue. The Green Zone is our calm and ready to learn Zone.

If you are interested in using the strategies at home they can be easily implemented. Students learn about the feelings they experience in each Zone and strategies to move back to the Green Zone. Below are some of the calm down strategies for each zone.

The Blue Zone

Sit on a comfy spot

Take a walk

Go for a short run or jog

Have a snack

The Yellow Zone

Meditation or use a calming jar

Wall pushups

Have a snack

Go for a short run

Meditation coloring

Take some deep belly breaths

Yoga

The Red Zone

Coloring

Lakeview Community Schools Preschool Selection Criteria

Selection Criteria

Students are placed depending on verified needs, age, and residence.

Priority placement for resident students in the special education program who are currently on an IFSP or IEP.

Priority placement will be given to resident students "At-Risk":

"At Risk" includes:

Students with verified low birth weight (with physician statement).

Students whose family income would qualify for Free and Reduced Lunches (income verification form based on Free & Reduced School Meal Family Application).

Students of teenage parents who have not currently obtained a high school diploma.

Students living in a home whose occupants have limited ability to speak and understand English.

Students four years of age (prior to 7/31 of the current year) qualifying as a resident

"Resident" includes students living within the Lakeview Community Schools District (LCS) boundaries.

Students three years of age (prior to 7/31 of the current year) qualifying as a resident

"Resident" includes students living within the Lakeview Community Schools District (LCS) boundaries.

LCS will consider option students for the preschool program at this time with the following criteria:

Option student with an older sibling currently enrolled at LCS through the Enrollment Option Program.

Son or daughter of LCS District Employee.

Students who were previously enrolled in the Lakeview Preschool Program.

Students who do not qualify as "at risk" or as "resident".

Submitting an application does not guarantee placement in the preschool program. Students will be placed by age according to the priority list.

Non-Resident Students

Non-resident students are welcome to submit an application to the Lakeview Preschool program. Parents who are considering this option need to understand the regulations for non-resident students and should visit with the superintendent or the elementary principal before making a final decision. All students will be placed according to the priority placement list.

Enrollment Criteria

- 1. Valid birth certificate
- 2. Up-to-Date Immunization record. Nebraska State law dictates that immunization records must be presented at the time of enrollment or that student cannot be enrolled.
- 3. All students must be potty-trained before attending preschool, unless otherwise stated in an IEP.

Free/Reduced Family Application, if applicable.
