## From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

March is here! I love the hope and enthusiasm that March brings when people start getting outside, the days get longer, and the doldrums of winter become a distant memory. In education, March is the month we begin to think about not only finishing the year strong but preparing to be even better next year. With that mind, we wanted to provide an update on the latest happenings with the Lakeview Jr./Sr. High Project and give a shortlist of projects happening at the elementary buildings this summer:

- **Lakeview Jr./Sr. High Project**
  - Construction is planned to begin in mid to late March. The first items to be worked on will be the three classroom addition and district office.
  - Once construction begins, the main front entrance will be shut down for the remainder of the school year and summer. Everyone will need to use the two west doors to get into the building.
  - Gyms/Weight Room/Wrestling Room will all be available throughout the summer for open gyms, camps, etc.
  - 1st bid package, including dirt work, site, foundation, and structural for the new classroom addition and the district office, is due back on February 25th.
  - 2nd bid package containing all the remaining items in the project is estimated to go out in late March.
  - Once students are released for the summer, the building will not have any occupancy other than the activity areas.
  - Once final designs and renderings are completed, they will be displayed on the district website. Stay tuned!
- **Elementary Buildings**
  - Renovations of the modular behind Platte Center elementary for the new Lakeview Preschool
  - Installation of new playground equipment at Shell Creek
  - Remodeling of the 5th-grade room at Platte Center
  - Replacing one air conditioning unit at Platte Center
- **Other Items**
  - Potential textbook adoption for Science will be done for the 2020-21 school year
  - Upgrading technology in the district with the addition of Chromebooks, desktop computers, teacher laptops, and iPad's
  - Replacing some outdated classroom furniture in all three buildings
  - Additional routine maintenance, painting, and upkeep

As you can see, we are continuing our commitment to providing our students with an excellent education and updated facilities. Improvement and growth are the most critical aspects of education, and we are committed to that not only in the classrooms but with our facilities!

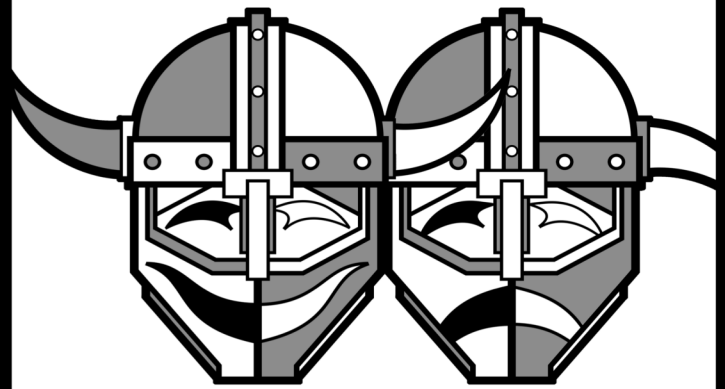

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## Wrapping up your senior year

Seniors... stay on track to college by completing these second-semester tasks:

**Complete the financial aid process.** By now, you should have filed your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). If you haven't, complete and file the form at [fafsa.gov](https://fafsa.gov). If your college requests verification of your FAFSA information, you must submit required documents before the school will award financial aid.

**Watch your student portal and email closely.** Once you're accepted for admission, the colleges you listed on your FAFSA will notify you of the financial aid they're offering.

**Keep your grades up.** If you slack off and get poor grades this semester, your college could revoke your admission.

**Apply for scholarships.** See [ScholarshipQuest](#) at [EducationQuest.org](https://EducationQuest.org) for Nebraska-based scholarships. You'll also find links to national scholarship sites that are EducationQuest-approved.

**Make your final college selection.** Notify the other colleges so they can take you off their mailing list.

**Be aware of deadlines** to accept financial aid and college admission offers, submit your housing deposit, and register for new-student orientation.

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## Juniors...it's time to narrow your college choices.

Narrow your college choices soon to prepare for these upcoming activities:

**ACT Test.** When you take the ACT this spring, you'll be asked to provide a list of colleges that should receive your score.

**Completion of the FAFSA** early next fall. You and your parents can complete the FAFSA beginning October 1 of your senior year. The colleges you list on the form will receive the results.

**College applications.** Early next fall, it will be time to apply to your top college choices. You'll get help at school if your high school holds an [Apply2College](#) event.

### District CDE's

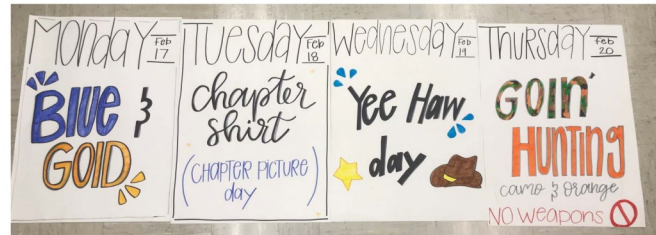

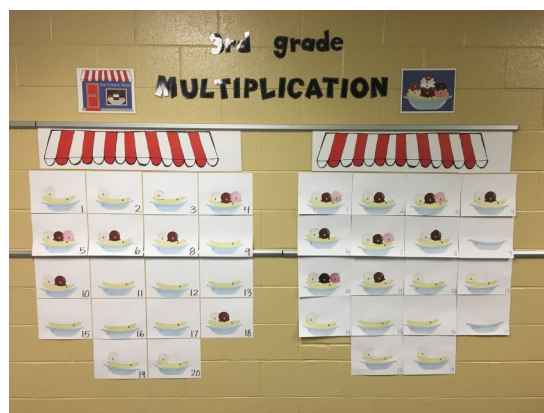
When we hear about the program Title I, we know it has something to do with schools, but most often aren't really sure what exactly the program is. Title I has been around since as early as 1965. It is the largest federally funded education program and Title I funds can be used to improve curriculum, instructional activities, counseling, parental involvement, and increase staff and program improvement. It also is the federal government's primary instrument for holding states, districts, and schools accountable for implementing standards-based education.

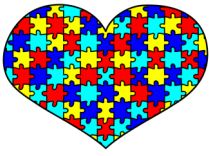
There are two types of programs within Title I, a targeted assistance program or a schoolwide program. Shell Creek and Platte Center are both schoolwide programs. This means that all students are eligible to receive support from Title I funds. Title I teachers provide interventions outside of classroom instruction to help struggling students grow. It can simply be thought of as the bridge between regular education and special education.

Title I services are available to all elementary students at Lakeview Community Schools. If you have questions about services available, feel free to contact your building principal.

If they pass they get to add a piece to their sundae, however, if they are not successful they will try again the next day. After a student collects all their parts for their sundae in the testing weeks, they will get to make their own ice cream sundae. If you are curious as to how the students are doing, walk down to the third grade rooms to look at their ice cream shop display.





## April is Autism Awareness Month

Next month is Autism Awareness month. Here are some facts about Autism.

- \*The symbol for Autism Awareness is the puzzle piece. The puzzle piece represents the mystery and complexity of Autism. The colors (red, blue, yellow,) represents the diversity of the families and people living with autism.
- \*No two individuals with Autism look or act the same. It looks different for each person. Each person has different strengths and weaknesses. It can be mild or severe.
- \*Some people with Autism can talk and others can not. Three main challenges of Autism are communication, social skills, and repetitive behaviors. Repetitive behavior includes repetitive movements with objects, repeated body movements such as rocking and hand-flapping, or involves saying or talking about the same things over and over again. Repetitive behaviors in autism can vary radically from person to person.
- \*People with autism sometimes have difficulty socializing. It might be hard for them to make eye contact, ask friends questions or join in with a group. New situations with people they don't know might be very scary for someone with autism.
- \*When interacting with someone with Autism remember, just because they are not looking at you doesn't mean that they are not listening. When talking to them, talk to them as an equal not down to them. Be patient and be kind!
- \*Many people with autism feel very anxious when asked to change their routine or schedule. While changes for everyone can be annoying, for someone with autism the reaction can be very extreme and ruin their day.
- \*People with autism can learn, make friends, and have fun.

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6th grade is having a strong start to their second semester and time is flying by. In math, we are currently learning how to find the circumference of a circle and have recently been introduced to  $\pi$  which is the mathematical symbol for 3.14. In Social Studies, 6th-grade students have found their characters for Shell Creek's second annual Wax Museum which will take place in late April. This is an event where students pick a deceased American hero or icon, dress as them and share their life story.

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### 4th Grade

We have been working hard and learning a lot in 4th grade this semester. In science, we have been talking about fast and slow changes to Earth's surface. Both classes had the opportunity to create a landslide plan to protect their pretend homes from the dangers of a landslide as well as experiment with different types of lava. In Nebraska History, students just finished learning about Lewis and Clark and are now starting to learn about the Oregon Trail. They are all so excited to build their own miniature covered wagon soon!

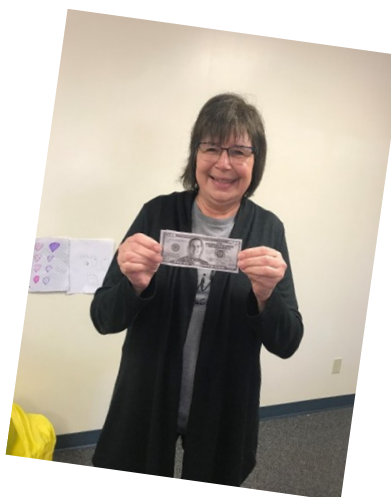
# In & Around Platte Center Elementary..

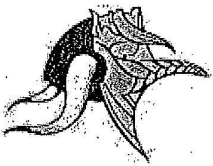
