







From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

We are approaching the end of the first quarter (October 16th) and wanted to provide some reminders on previously communicated information regarding safety protocols at Lakeview Community Schools, and future plans as we navigate this unprecedented school year.

All communication will be sent out via the LCS Bright Arrow communication system using text message and email. Please ensure your phone number and email address are accurate on PowerSchool and you have "opted in" to receive the text messages. Please call your child's school building if you need additional information or assistance

Decisions on changes within the school system will be made and published on a quarterly basis, if possible. The current LCS safety protocols are planned to be in place until October 16th.

We will communicate the second quarter safety protocols the week of October 12th to ensure we are using the latest data and guidance available.

Lakeview Community Schools will NOT exclusively use the East Central Risk Assessment Dial in all decision-making. This dial will be used as a tool in the decision-making process, but it will not be the only factor used when changing tiers or risk mitigation techniques. Other factors will include spread and quarantines within the school system, community positivity rate, and positivity within the county. The current ECHD risk dial can be found online at:

Our school district values the education that can be provided in a traditional face-to-face environment and will prioritize this type of learning whenever possible. In order to make that happen, we must have risk mitigation protocols to both ensure our students and staff are safe, and limit the potential for quarantines. This is the only way to satisfy our requirement to provide a safe environment and our beliefs that in-person instruction is the best education we can provide for students

We can't thank you enough for your continued commitment and willingness to wear masks, social distance, and sanitize your hands. These safety measures have reduced the spread of the virus, ensured limited quarantines for students and staff, and kept us in a traditional face-to-face educational environment. Go Vikings!

Dyscalculia By : Brittany Niedbalski

Dyscalculia is a condition that affects the ability to acquire arithmetical skills. A dyscalculic learner may have difficulty understanding simple number concepts, lack an intuitive grasp of numbers, and have problems learning number facts and procedures, even if they produce a correct answer or use a correct method, they may do so mechanically and without confidence. A dyscalculia learner stands out as having no 'feel for numbers' at all, no ability to estimate even small quantities, and no idea whether an answer to an arithmetic problem is reasonable or not. Some indicators for dyscalculia include: an inability to subitize (see without counting) even very small quantities, an inability to estimate whether a numerical answer is reasonable, weaknesses in both short-term and long-term memory, an inability to count backwards reliably, a weakness in visual and spatial orientation, directional (left/right) confusion, slow processing speeds when engaged in math activities, trouble with sequencing, a tendency not to notice patterns, a problem with all aspects of money, a marked delay in learning to read a clock to tell the time, an inability to manage time in daily life.

4th Grade at Shell Creek

Our fourth graders are excited to be back at school and settling into their new routines. The students are doing an awesome job wearing their masks every day! In math, we have been learning about place value and writing numbers in different ways. In reading, we have been reading about natural disasters and comparing and contrasting them. The students tried out Flipgrid for the first time sharing their classmate interviews. We're having a great start to our year! Go Vikings!!







Mystery Science By Mrs. Osten

The 2nd graders at Shell Creek did the first mystery science lesson of the year. They explored the different properties of materials used for clothing, such as texture, flexibility, and absorbency. They enjoyed using this information to design and build a hat that protects them from the sun. First the groups did tests on the materials for softness, sweat soakerness, and stiffness. Then the groups showed great creativity and teamwork as they worked to create their hats from paper towels, paper plates, tin foil, a paper sack, clips, and string. Lastly, groups had to present to their classmates on why they put certain materials where they did, what they liked about their hats, and what they would change to make it better.
