

to do daily for my students.







Dear 1st through 6th Grade Shell Creek Parents/Guardians,

Shell Creek Elementary grades 1-6 will be participating in a very special community service program to raise funds for the American Heart Association. We're joining in the fight against our nation's No. 1 and No. 3 killers – cardiovascular disease and stroke. Kids Heart Challenge (aka-Jump Rope for Heart) is a nationwide event that helps students learn about the benefits of regular physical activity and heart health while raising funds to fight heart disease and stroke. The money our school raises will fund potentially lifesaving research and will support programs that help people in our community. The Shell Creek Students will be doing their Jump Rope for Heart on November 3rd and 5th 2020 during P.E. class at Shell Creek Elementary.

Most people do not realize that the roots for cardiovascular disease in adults often begin in childhood from age 10 and even younger. That's why it's important to make changes now to help your children and other family members eat healthy foods, stay physically active, and live tobacco-free.

As this year's coordinator, the students have shown a lot of interest and excitement in taking part in this year's Kids Heart Challenge. I will be sending home with each of them an information/money envelope along with this letter. This will have a listing of the prizes they can earn as well as your child's consent form. That's right I said prizes! Students who collect money donations for their schools Jump Rope for Heart event will receive dollar amount prizes for their hard work from the American Heart Association.

This year I am asking all parents to convert all cash and coin collected into one check. It makes it a lot easier to count the individual money collected and get it sent so the students receive their prizes sooner. If someone that donates wants to write a check, please ask him or her to write it out to the <u>American Heart Association</u>. They can also go online and donate to your child after registering your child online. See collection envelope for information to register online. I ask that you do not allow your son or daughter to go door to door asking for money donations. I would prefer that they ask friends and family for money donations. Parents may take collection envelopes to their place of employment if they wish. I am giving the students two weeks to collect money donations and turn the money back into me by November 3, 2020.

Kids Heart Challenge is a fun and effective way to teach heart-healthy living. It emphasizes the importance of physical activity as our children do something they enjoy. The money you contribute will fund research that will save more lives each year... maybe your own or that of someone in your family. Our efforts can truly make a difference. Shell Creek ~ School Counselor News

This month we are focusing on emotional awareness during guidance. The purpose of these lessons is to help students identify specific feeling words, learn definitions of new feeling words, recognize feelings in self and others and understand that all feelings are okay! Students will participate in a variety of activities to identify feeling faces, how feelings feel in our body, and comfortable vs. uncomfortable feelings. Finally, we discuss how to calm down big feelings.

~ Help your child build emotional awareness

Below is a list of simple activities you can do to help your child learn more about their emotions.

- Ask your child how he/she is feeling. List some feeling words to choose from.
- Share how you are feeling!
- Play feelings charades. Show feelings on your face and body.
- Read stories with your child and talk about how the characters are feeling.

~Why is emotional awareness important?

Children who are able to identify how they feel are often better able to communicate their needs. They are also more likely to understand the feelings of their friends, classmates, and the grown-ups in their lives. When students are aware of their own feelings and the feelings of others, they are able to build empathy! Empathy is the ability to see and understand what someone else is feeling. We teach students to show empathy and compassion to those around them!






Christ Lutheran School News
