There has been a lot of negatives during the year 2020. In fact, it doesn't take long into most conversations before someone is making a crack about the expiration of 2020 and the welcoming of a new year. And while I think this is universally accepted as one of the most difficult years in our history, there are still many things to be thankful for as we close the books on this year and turn the calendar to new and better. This is an open letter of thanks to the most challenging year in most of our lives.

Dear 2020,

I want to thank you for all that you have taught me over the last 365 days. When January began, we were hopeful and celebrating the promise of a new calendar year after the devastation of statewide flooding during 2019. We were excited to turn the page, continue to rebuild, and work together to control our future after the uncontrollable event. Little did we know that we were months away from a global pandemic that would turn our lives upside down. The pandemic would bring on sickness, uncertainty, division, stress, and a complete disruption of our normal routines.

After nine months of the pandemic not allowing us to live our 'normal lives,' we have seen human ingenuity at its finest. Events and meetings have moved virtual, recognition was delivered in unique ways, and social interaction has shifted to new mediums. These unprecedented circumstances have allowed our problem-solving skills to shine. And while a break from consistently problem-solving will be welcomed, it is something that we are thankful got to be put on display throughout 2020. Too often when change is put in front of us, our instant reaction is to keep things as they have always been. But this year has taught us that we have the ability to change, be flexible, provide grace, reflect on decisions, and create a new path forward. And while it was an uncomfortable journey, it has been one that brought out the best in so many people.

In conclusion, THANK YOU 2020! Thanks for all the lessons you have provided and the growth you allowed. The challenges you had in store for us were unthinkable twelve months ago, but we have risen to them and will be better in 2021 because of you. So thank you for everything, but please don't reach out to contact us, as we won't be returning your calls!

Dear Kindergarten through 6th Grade Platte Center Parents/Guardians,

Platte Center Elementary grades K-6 will be participating in a very special community service program to raise funds for the American Heart Association. We're joining in the fight against our nation's No. 1 and No. 3 killers – cardiovascular disease and stroke. Kids Heart Challenge (aka-Jump Rope for Heart) is a nationwide event that helps students learn about the benefits of regular physical activity and heart health while raising funds to fight heart disease and stroke. The money our school raises will fund potentially lifesaving research and will support programs that help people in our community. The Platte Center students will be doing their Jump Rope for Heart on February 1st and 3rd 2021 during P.E. class at Platte Center Elementary.

Most people do not realize that the roots for cardiovascular disease in adults often begin in childhood from age 10 and even younger. That's why it's important to make changes now to help your children and other family members eat healthy foods, stay physically active, and live tobacco-free.

As this year's coordinator, the students have shown a lot of interest and excitement in taking part in this year's Kids Heart Challenge. I will be sending home with each of them an information/money envelope along with this letter. This will have a listing of the prizes they can earn as well as your child's consent form. That's right I said prizes! Students who collect money donations for their schools Kids Heart Challenge event will receive dollar amount prizes for their hard work from the American Heart Association.

This year I am asking all parents to convert all cash and coin collected into one check. It makes it a lot easier to count the individual money collected and get it sent so the students receive their prizes sooner. If someone that donates wants to write a check, please ask him or her to write it out to the <u>American Heart Association</u>. I also encourage you to register your child online and collect money donations that way due to COVID-19. See collection envelope for information to register online. I ask that you do not allow your son or daughter to go door to door asking for money donations. I would prefer that they ask friends and family for money donations. Parents may take collection envelopes to their place of employment if they wish. <u>I am giving the students two weeks to collect money donations</u> and turn the money back into me by January 27, 2021
