From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

The 2021 legislative session kicked off in early January as they begin the long 90-day session. The budget will be thoroughly examined and cut appropriately as it is each year to match revenues. This year there seems to be more questions as we have yet to determine the final impacts that the coronavirus has had on the state of Nebraska. As they begin to look at areas to cut, if history holds true, one of the first areas will be K-12 education as it accounts for about 25% of the state budget. While many do not think we receive state aid, we do for special education reimbursements and option enrollment. Like many (170 of the 244 schools in NE) we do NOT receive any type of equalization aid since our resources (property valuation) outweigh our needs according to the TEEOSA formula. Due to this funding mechanism, Nebraska ranks 49th in the country in state aid given to schools. Because of the lack of state money being put into education it is not surprising that Nebraska also ranks 7th in the country for reliance on local property taxes. Here at Lakeview, since we are not able to receive any type of 'equalization aid' from our state, our property owners are forced to shoulder a large majority of the financial needs for our school district.

In many recent interviews, Governor Pete Ricketts has said high property taxes are a direct result of local schools overspending. This is flat out NOT TRUE! Nebraska schools have averaged a 3.25% increase per year to their general fund over the last 10 years. Lakeview has outperformed that by averaging just a 0.99% spending increase per year over the last 10 years despite our student population increasing by 27%. With increasing insurance rates, wages, electric costs, fuel costs, and transportation costs I would consider these statewide and Lakeview increases pretty darn good!

In response to this negative publicity, Lakeview has been trying to be active in not only spreading a positive message about public schools but also working to advocate for a new funding mechanism for public education in our state. We have been working with several organizations to come up with a common message to take to the legislature that includes needing adequate and sustainable funding for K-12 education, and tax reform which reduces the over-reliance on local property taxes.

You will be seeing some articles in local and state newspapers in the next week or two about this very topic. Please know Lakeview is not sitting back and doing nothing about this misinformation and funding mechanism problem. We want to be on the front lines trying to do what is best for our students, our school, and our patrons.

Scholarships

Seniors, it's scholarship season! Here are different ways to access information regarding scholarships opportunities.

1. Email: check your email for new scholarships that are coming through the counseling office.

3. ScholarshipQuest: ScholarshipQuest posts over 2000 Nebraska based scholarships for students. All Lakeview seniors have a ScholarshipQuest account.
4. College Websites: Check your college's website for college specific scholarships.

Registration

Class registration for the 2021-2022 school year is soon approaching. I will be visiting with all students about graduation requirements and the required courses for their upcoming school year. Students will then be coming home with a registration form to be signed by a parent or guardian listing the classes that they wish to take for the upcoming school year. Required courses will be listed on the top. Please see the following document on Lakeview's Graduation Requirements. If you have any questions regarding the courses that your child should be taking next year, please email or call. Lakeview also offers several dual credit courses along with internship opportunities for students to include in their class schedule.

Dual Credit Courses:

Students need to be aware that their course selections in high school will either enhance their post high school opportunities or limit them. Each post high school option has its own admission requirements. Each student is expected to be proactive in planning to meet those requirements for the post high school option of their choice. Students have the option to earn college credit while in high school. Students planning on attending college after high school may choose to take advantage

of the different options that Lakeview offers. Tuition and admissions testing are the responsibility of the student however the school counseling department will gladly assist in preparing for college credit courses.

Online and Onsite College Classes – Students who are on track to graduate and have permission from the administration may enroll in online/onsite classes at the various community colleges. Students who qualify may be given a period during the school day to work on their college class. Students may also take onsite college courses at Central Community College if scheduling permits. Students are responsible for paying for tuition and books for these classes. Students typically do not earn high school credit from Lakeview High School for these classes. It is highly recommended that students check with the technical school, college, or university they plan to attend to ensure that credits will transfer.

Dual Credit – Dual credit classes offer the students the opportunity to earn high school and college credits at the same time. Our current offerings are College Algebra, General Biology, College English and Public Speaking which are all offered through CCC. Lakeview also offers Calculus through Nebraska Wesleyan. It is highly recommended that students check with the technical school, college, or university they plan to attend to ensure that credits will transfer. Students are responsible for tuition for the college credits, but Lakeview provides the books.

What is Math Anxiety?

Does your child often avoid math homework or get easily frustrated when trying to solve mathematical problems? Do you as a parent feel frustrated or overwhelmed with helping your student with math? The cause of the math stress is often math anxiety. Math anxiety includes an extreme negative physical, emotion, and cognitive reaction to math that hinders a persons ability to learn and perform math activities. Students as young as five years old can experience math anxiety, this not only affects standardized testing, and school exams but also affects a students ability to learn new math concepts. Math anxiety can also affect other areas of a students or adults life, it can impact the career choice a person makes, and it can affect their financial and personal choices due to avoidance of using math.

What can we do to help a student with math anxiety?

If we notice our child is experiencing math anxiety, we can increase our knowledge in math and not show anxiety towards math or a negative attitude towards math. Find math apps to help our child increase their confidence in math and increase his/her skills in math as an app is not judgmental and cannot react to a students behavior towards math. Praise your child when he or she has math success and remind him/her of their past math success to boost self-confidence. Talk to your child's teacher about what you are seeing and experiencing at home, he/she may be seeing the same things at school and you can work together to make a plan to help your child be successful at home and school.

2nd Grade December Happenings at Shell Creek

December was a busy month for Shell Creek 2nd Graders! We had many exciting things going on-a Santa visit, Christmas around the World activities, and a Gooney Bird Greene novel study in reading-just to name a few!

The 2nd graders gathered in Mrs. Osten's classroom one December morning to Zoom with Santa. We wrote letters to him and got to chat about our favorite cookie and what was on our list.

You might catch a 2nd grader saying "God Jul" around Christmas time. We learned about all sorts of countries and how they celebrate the Christmas season. We even got to do a craft for each country we learned about as well. Yule logs were made when we learned about France and stockings for England.

Second graders also got to read a novel-Gooney Bird Greene. Gooney Bird is a unique student who enters a 2nd grade classroom a month into the school year. She dresses oddly and she's a great storyteller! We had so much fun reading together and learning writing tips from this novel study!

The 6th graders are super excited to have trout in the classroom once again! We received our trout eggs on Jan 14th and are currently watching them grow. The students do weekly water tests on pH, ammonia, nitrites, and nitrates to make sure our levels are safe and healthy for our trout. We do not get to release them at Schramm park this year again, due to COVID but we are working on a plan where they will be able to hopefully release them somewhere. We completed our winter MAPs testing over reading and math in January and are excited to see continued growth when we test again in the spring. The students have been working really hard so far this year and have done a great job of handling everything that has been thrown at them. Currently, we are working on ratios, rates, and data analysis in math. In reading, we are beginning our 3rd novel of the year, *Williwaw!*. In science, we are learning about animals and how to use a dichotomous key.

Learning how to read and write in cursive is something all of the third graders at Shell Creek do. This is not an easy task. Cursive writing takes a lot of practice. It is essentially learning how to make each letter of the alphabet in a new way, learning how to connect the letters to each other and then being able to read it. 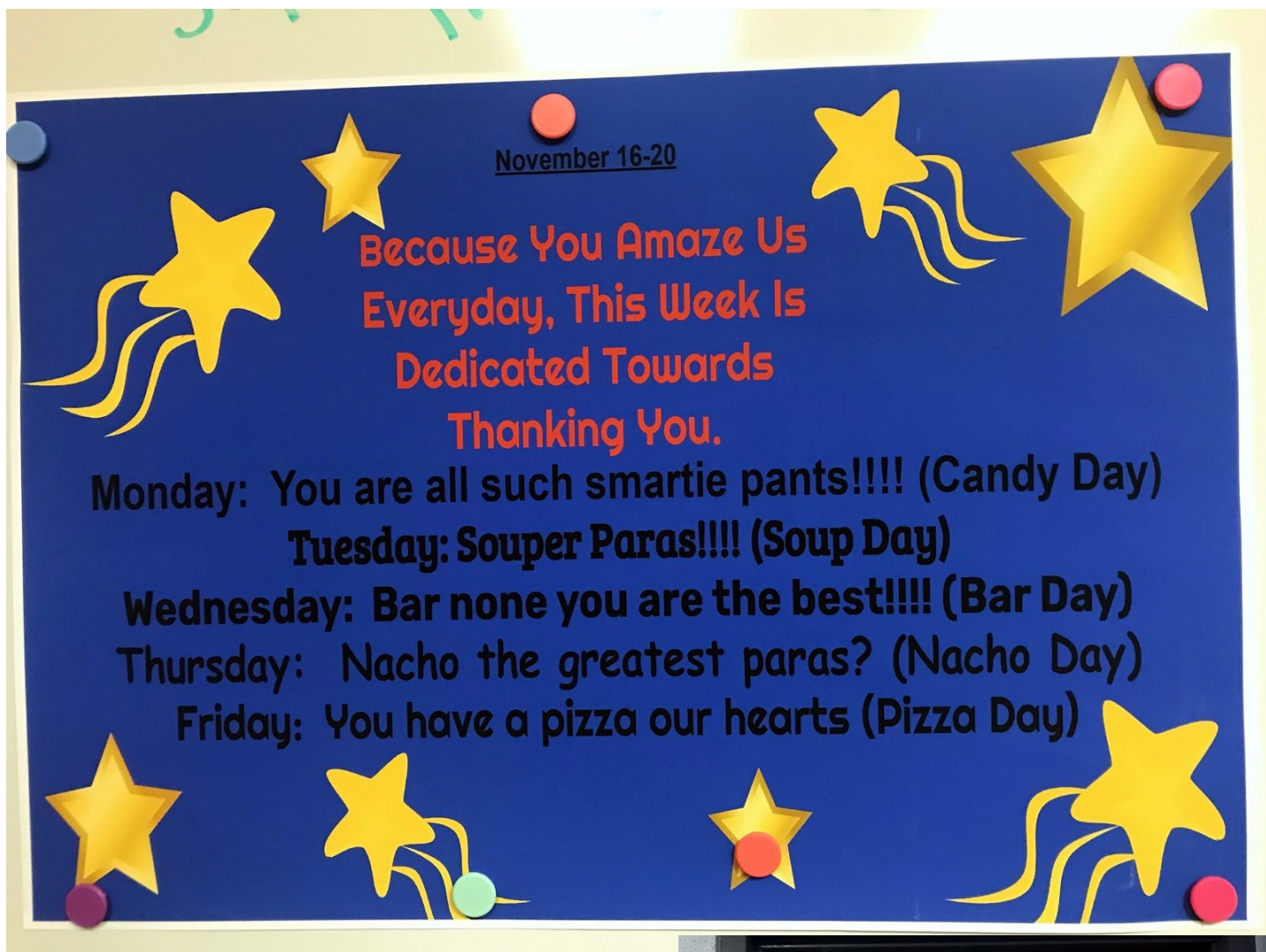

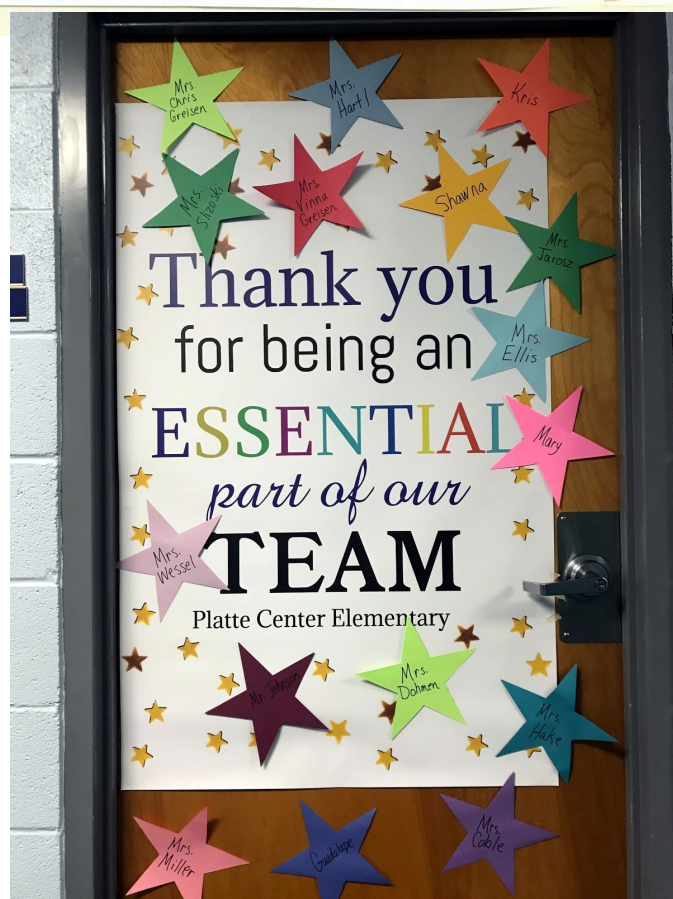

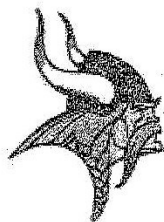
