Change is on the Horizon

The Lakeview Jr./Sr. High construction project has completed two of the four construction phases and is closing in on finishing the third. The first phase of the project included a total renovation of the fifty-year-old portion of the building, including new HVAC, electrical, lighting, carpet, and paint. This new phase was completed in the summer of 2020 and gave an awesome facelift to the building. The second phase included the addition of three classrooms on the east side of the building. The three classrooms were completed by Thanksgiving, and we are so proud of our new state-of-the-art Family Consumer Science, Life Skills, and Art classrooms. The next phase is drawing quite a bit of attention in the community with the erection of a new gymnasium and activity commons area. This modernized gym will improve safety, spectator viewing, and allow for more district/conference competitions at Lakeview. This phase is running ahead of schedule and will be completed during the early summer. Finally, the last phase has broken ground as they begin to construct a new Ag addition and renovate the Industrial Technology lab. This expansion will ensure that Lakeview has world-class agricultural education, and a modern Industrial Technology program that will provide immediate employment skills that match our community needs.

Lakeview Community Schools is a fast-growing district that is sure to see more changes in the future. How exciting to be a part of a school district and community that is in demand! So often in rural Nebraska, you hear of schools fighting to keep their doors open with declining enrollment, but that is definitely not the case with Lakeview as we continue to grow, expand, and change! It is a great time to be a Viking!

Shell Creek 5th Grade Happenings

In January, we came back from break and read a novel titled, *Esperanza Rising*. Students learned a lot about a different culture and had the opportunity to try many different kinds of food! Students also started their unit in Science about everything and anything in space.

In February, we exchanged candy and treats for Valentine's Day. We had a reading unit that focused on Black History month and we watched the movie *Ruby Bridges* to give students a better idea of what the time period in history was like. We also survived a couple snow days and cold days! :)

In March, the Platte County 4H Extension Office came and did an activity with students about what a Watershed is and which one they live in. Also this month, students finished up a Unit about the American Revolution. Students learned what led the Patriots into fighting for freedom from the King of England. They will now start looking at the United States government.

In April, we jumped right into our state NSCAS testing for math, reading, and science. We spent time reviewing material in all subjects to prepare for them. At the end of the month we will be having a couple in building "field trips" since we can't go on our regular field trips this year with Covid. We will be having a leadership half day that the Platte County 4H Extension Office will be coming to put on for us. For the second part of the day we will be doing Groundwater Festival Activities that are normally hosted by CCC in Grand Island. Students have also started a new exciting unit in Science about chemical reactions!



We love creating a positive classroom community in kindergarten! The kindergartners at Shell Creek just wrapped up their opinion writing unit with a project that showed us how special everyone is. Each student had to decide what they liked best about themselves and then explain why. After they did their writing, we took a picture of each child's favorite thing. We even created QR codes on the iPads so each author could hear themselves reading it. It was so much fun reading each students response and the variety of favorite things they came up with.



May Is Better Hearing and Speech Month

Each May, Better Hearing and Speech Month provides an opportunity to raise awareness about communication disorders and the role of Speech-Language Pathologists in providing life-altering treatments. A Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP) is a part of the special education team. They help kids with a wide range of communication and reading issues. SLPs take part in the intervention and evaluation process. They work with students who get related services through their IEP. Their goal is to help improve how well a child is learning and performing in the classroom. To do this, they often focus on a child's ability to understand and use language. SLPs work on many different areas of communication with students. This might include:

- *Helping students learn to pronounce sounds correctly
- *Increasing students' vocabulary knowledge and usage
- *Helping students learn what words to use in what order, and when to say them
- *Helping students with minimal speech find ways to communicate (such as by using a computerized device or a picture system)
- *Helping students that stutter make their speech more fluent
- *Helping students that have difficulty with comprehension or answering questions
- *Helping students learn the unspoken social rules of communication
- *Helping students that struggle with getting their thoughts out in a coherent fashion, whether verbally or in writing

If you think your child could benefit from speech-language help, you can start by talking with his/her teacher about your concerns. These concerns are taken to the SAT Team and if the needs are impacting your child's education, he/she may be referred for testing to determine if they meet the state guidelines to qualify. In the Lakeview district, there are two Speech-Language Pathologists. Sara Werner serves Lakeview and Platte Center and Nancy Briggs serves Shell Creek. Both SLPs would be happy to answer any questions you may have.



Happenings in 6B at Shell Creek

The 6th graders have been busy this semester. We have been just finished up learning about properties of waves in science class as well as continuing to care for our trout in the classroom. The trout are continuing to do well as they are growing like crazy and we currently still have 186 alive out of approximately 200 eggs. We will be releasing them towards the end of the school year at a location to be determined yet as we are still in contact with the Game and Parks on where we can do that safely.

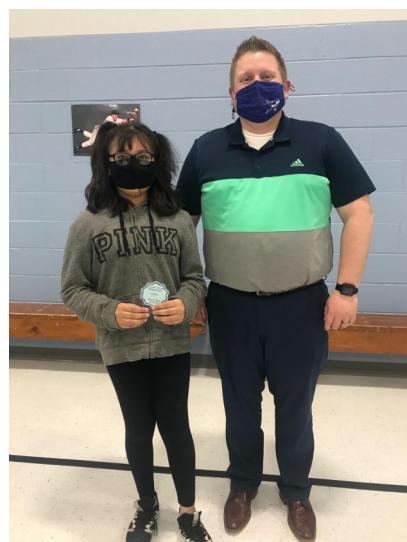
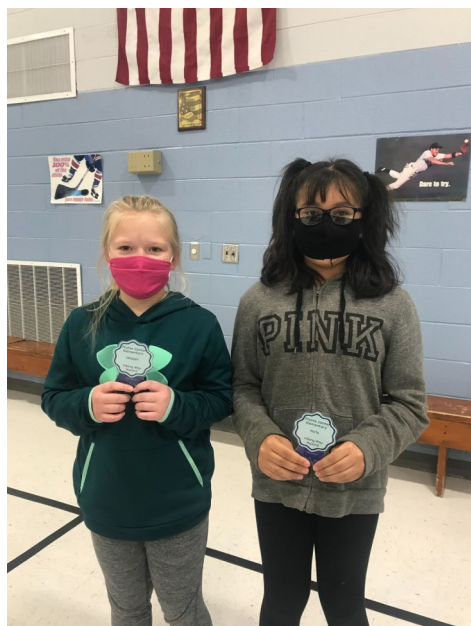

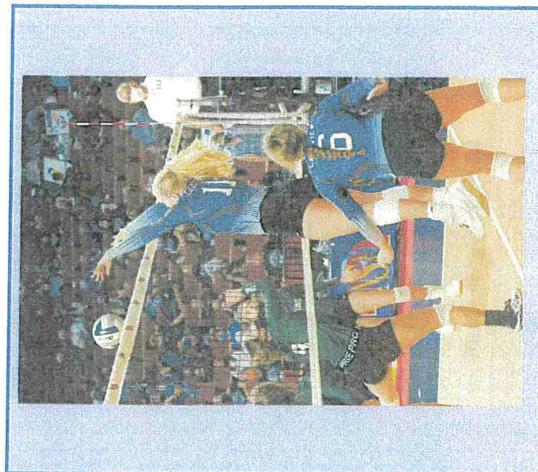


2021 Lakeview Volleyball Skills Camp

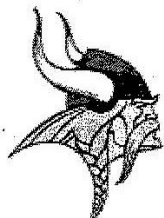
