From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

"Back to School" is the best time of the year! After having the summer off to prepare the buildings, better our curriculum, sharpen our teaching skills, and set up new programming, we are ready for the 2021-22 school year to begin! I hope this newsletter finds everyone settling into the new school year and the routines that come with it. We are excited to see the students back in the buildings!

District Theme

Each year we start as a staff by discussing our district theme. Our theme for 2021-22 is "Reinvest in Success." LCS has experienced amazing success in recent years with the passing of a bond issue, adding a preschool, improved career offerings for students, adding technology, improving intervention systems, revising teacher collaboration processes, and implementing a new reading program. Lakeview Community School will now "reinvest in success" with the implementation of a one-to-one initiative this school year that will provide all students K-12 with a device. The reinvestment will continue throughout the year with a proposal to build additional elementary classrooms at Shell Creek Elementary. Like any great organization, we must continue to reinvest in ourselves to continue to move forward, improve, and become the best school district in the great state of Nebraska.

Shell Creek Elementary Addition

As our school district and community continue to grow, it means our facilities need to match that growth. Shell Creek Elementary has experienced incredible increases in enrollment over the last ten years, resulting in facilities that have exceeded capacity limits in four of the previous six years. With that, an addition to Shell Creek Elementary is being worked on with an anticipated opening for the 2022-23 school year. Below is information on this addition.

<u>Why?</u> Shell Creek Elementary has experienced incredible growth over the last ten years. When the Shell Creek building was expanded in 2012, the building enrollment was 183 students, but the first day of school this year brought in 307 students. This 67.8% increase in enrollment over the last ten years has led to increased class sizes and crowded learning spaces, with an expectation student enrollment increases will continue as our community grows with additional housing developments.

What? Some basics on the proposed construction include the addition of six primary classrooms including a Preschool, Kindergarten, Ist Grade, 2nd Grade, 3rd Grade, and an open room for future growth.

<u>When And Where?</u> The plan at this time is to add these classrooms directly to the east of the current building. We are hoping for the construction to be completed and the classrooms operational by the start of the 2022-23 school year. However, staffing of the building will be phased in over a two-year period.
