School attendance is so important to the education of our students. Chronic absenteeism, which is defined as missing 10 percent or more of school for any reason including excused and unexcused absences, is a proven predictor of academic trouble. In addition, attendance gaps can often lead to achievement gaps that can undermine student success. The issues with chronic absenteeism extend beyond just those that are missing as it can cause the teacher to spend time reviewing for students who missed lessons.

Good attendance is essential to student achievement and ultimately graduation. Lakeview Community Schools is committed to dedicating resources and attention to reducing chronic absenteeism. But the best way to reduce chronic absenteeism is when schools, families, and the community work together to monitor and promote good attendance. Together we can get this done!

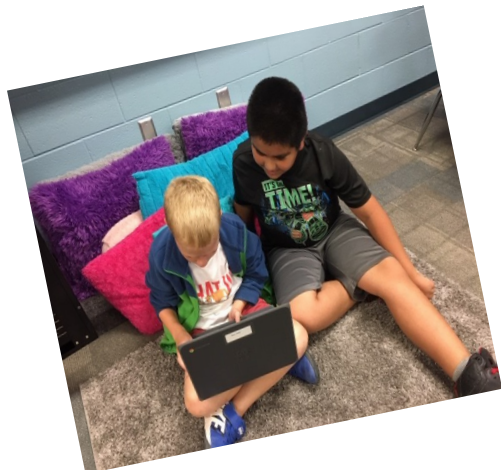

Hello Lakeview! My name is Duke and I recently moved into Mrs. Colvin's classroom at Shell Creek! This place is amazing! The kids come in and read to me everyday! I can't believe how much better at reading they have gotten in just the first month of school! They love to pet me and I love it too! It has been so much fun getting to know all these amazing kiddos!

Mrs. Colvin has been busy doing the reading screening tests and getting all our WIN groups set up. WIN stands for What I Need. Each student is screened at the beginning, middle and end of the school year to check and see if they need any additional help in any areas of reading. They are then placed into an intervention group that targets the specific skill sets that will help them to improve in reading.

This year we've implemented a new screening program called FastBridge. FastBridge combines Computer Adaptive Tests (CAT) and Curriculum-Based Measures (CBM) to screen students, identify skill gaps, and offer proven recommendations for reading instruction and diagnostic reading interventions. It also offers screening in the areas of math and social emotional behavior. While we are focusing on the reading portion right now, we are excited to implement these areas as the year progresses.

I can't wait to see how the rest of the year is going to go! I hope everyone is staying safe!

Greetings from the Shell Creek computer lab! The beginning of the school year is always a busy time in the lab.
