## From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

Lakeview Jr./Sr. High conducted an Open House on September 21st at the newly remodeled facility. I was lucky enough to get a few minutes to address the crowd during the event. During this speech, I had the opportunity to thank so many people that made the project happen and be successful. Below is a text copy of the address. Thank you so much to everyone that made this facility enhancement a reality!

### Open House Address

On behalf of Lakeview Community Schools and the Board of Education, I want to thank everyone for being here to attend the Open House for the newly renovated Lakeview Jr./Sr. High School. We are excited to welcome back alumni, community members, parents, staff, students, and friends of the district.

If you are here for the Open House, you know that Lakeview Jr./Sr. High has taken on an extensive facelift over the last two years, but our history at Lakeview Community Schools runs much deeper than just this latest facility project. Lakeview has been a premier district in the state of Nebraska for over fifty years. But the foundation of our district was established by the community that wanted this school district to become a home to the students in northern Platte county. And we stand here today “rooted in THEIR legacy” because none of this would have been possible without the vision, passion, leadership, and determination of the many patrons of our district that started this school from the ground up in 1969 with the construction of a state-of-the-art facility. Our community was both generous and trusting when you entered the voting booth on October 15th, 2019, and you approved a bond issue that changed the long-term trajectory of our community school district. We hope you are as proud of this new facility as we are. Thank you, Lakeview patrons and community! You are amazing!

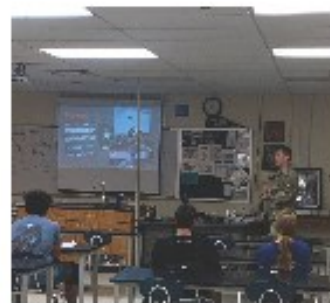

# ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TIDBITS

## MTSS

Shell Creek teachers will be using a system to assist all students in organization and problem solving to improve their academics and behavior. This system is called Multi-tiered System of Support or MTSS. MTSS is defined as an instructional system based on the concept that ALL students require early and powerful academic and behavioral core instruction with the potential for high-quality interventions of increasing intensity.

A team of teachers who represent a variety of roles meet two times a month to problem solve and make decisions on student's progress in their academic, behavior, and social and emotional needs in order to support student learning. This team consists of the classroom teachers, Title I teacher, ELL teacher, resource teacher, guidance counselor and principal. MTSS utilizes evidence-based core practices, intervention strategies, and assessment tools to ensure that every student receives the appropriate level of support to be successful. Decision for interventions may consist of more one-on-one or small group settings and increase time which are based on data collected. The intervention intensity increases when student's needs are not improving. Teachers will communicate with parents when their child is involved and at what level of intervention is being tried. The parents will be then asked to attend a meeting to discuss their child's program. This system supports learning for all students at Shell Creek Elementary School.



## In & Around Shell Creek Elementary...

On September 29, Cornhusker Public Power came to share with the 5th & 6th Graders the importance of power safety. Students learned about the difference between insulators and conductors and what some of them look like on power poles. They also demonstrated many electrical mistakes that happen in and around neighborhoods and homes. Students also learned how to safely remove themselves from a vehicle if there is a down power line and the vehicle is unsafe to be in. Jay and Cameron who work as linemen for CPPD helped present. Cameron even climbed a telephone pole outside the school for us, and showed us the different parts of their work gear they wear. Thanks for coming Cornhusker Public Power! Our students are now much more knowledgeable and can help their families be safe around electricity and power units!

Here is a glance at what is happening during classroom visits at Shell Creek!

**School Wide** - We are taking a little extra time to focus on kindness. All Shell Creek students were all asked to decorate an acorn to add to this tree. The message or picture on the acorn had to reflect what they were going to do or what they would like to see others do to spread kindness at Shell Creek Elementary this fall. The acorns will be displayed until Thanksgiving time as a reminder we can all be kind!



**Kindergarten** - Zones of Regulation (see below to implement at home) listening to our feelings, calming down and learning to wait

**1st Grade** - Zones of Regulation (see below to implement at home) being part of a community, handling curiosity, following directions, and feelings

**2nd Grade** - focusing attention, respectful listening, assertive communication, and confidence

**3rd Grade** - friendships and how our actions make other people have thoughts and feelings

**4th Grade** - assertive communication

**5th Grade** - understanding the perspectives of others and empathy

**6th Grade** - positive and negative consequences of our reactions when using passive and aggressive communication

## Using the Zones of Regulation at Home

While it's not mandatory to use this program at home, children may become very interested in using this inside and outside of school. The Zones of Regulation - written and created by Leah M. Kuypers, MA Ed OTR/L contains lessons we completed along with the language we provide the students with. The Zones of Regulation contains four categories of emotions, Green, Red, Yellow, and Blue. The Green Zone is our calm and ready to learn Zone.

If you are interested in using the strategies at home they can be easily implemented. Students learn about the feelings they experience in each Zone and strategies to move back to the Green Zone. Below are some of the calm down strategies for each zone.

### The Blue Zone

Sit on a comfy spot  
Take a walk  
Go for a short run or jog  
Have a snack

### The Yellow Zone

Meditation or use a calming jar  
Wall pushups  
Have a snack  
Go for a short run  
Meditation coloring

### The Red Zone

Coloring  
Take some deep belly breaths  
Sit on a bean bag (or in a comfy spot)

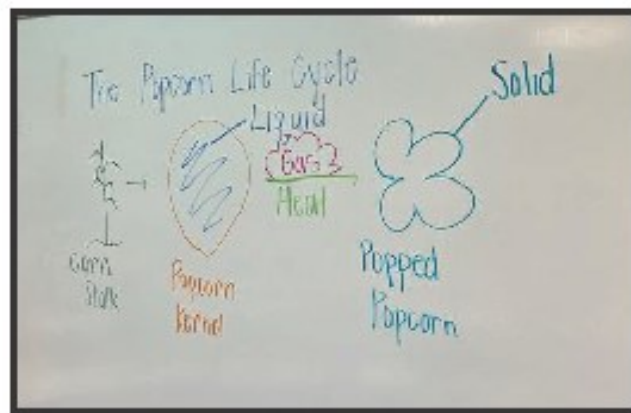
## Positively Popcorn
