





From The Superintendent's Desk — By Dr. Plas

This year the legislative budget is in a place it hasn't been for a long time as they decide what to do with over \$400 million in excess revenue compared to expectations. The 2022 legislative session kicked off in early January as they began the short 60-day session. Early in the session, the budget will be thoroughly examined to ensure the expenses will match the state revenues. The battle lines are already being drawn between spending the additional revenue on state services such as infrastructure, broadband, prisons, and education or putting it into the state reserves.

My hope is that some of that money is injected into the PK-12 education system, allowing for some property tax relief. While many do not think we receive state aid, we do for special education reimbursements and option enrollment. Like many (157 of the 244 schools in NE), we do NOT receive any equalization aid since our resources (property valuation) outweigh our needs according to the TEEOSA formula. Due to this funding mechanism, Nebraska ranks 49th in the country with regard to state contribution to K-12 education. Because of the lack of state money invested into education, Nebraska also ranks 7th in the nation for reliance on local property taxes. Here at Lakeview, since we are not able to receive any type of 'equalization aid' from our state, our property owners are forced to shoulder a large majority of the financial needs of our school district.

The typical rhetoric from politicians will say that high property taxes directly result from local schools' overspending. But like most simple statements, there is a lot more to the story! Nebraska schools have averaged a 3.00% increase per year to their general fund over the last ten years (compared to a 3.17% increase in state government spending). Lakeview has outperformed that by averaging just a 1.80% spending increase per year over the last decade despite our student population increasing over 25%. That is a 1.80% increase despite rising insurance rates, wages, electric costs, fuel costs, and transportation costs.

You will be seeing some articles in local and state newspapers about this very topic in the next week or two. Please know Lakeview is not sitting back and doing nothing. We work hard through our various organizations to improve education and its funding. We want to be on the front lines trying to do what is best for our students, school, and patrons.

Lakeview Community Schools Preschool Selection Criteria

Selection Criteria

Students are placed depending on verified needs, age, and residence.

- Priority placement for resident students in the special education program who are currently on an IFSP or IEP.
- 2. Priority placement will be given to resident students "At-Risk":
 - a. "At Risk" includes:
 - i. Students with verified low birth weight (with physician statement).
 - ii. Students whose family income would qualify for Free and Reduced Lunches (income verification form based on *Free & Reduced School Meal Family Application*).
 - Students of teenage parents who have not currently obtained a high school diploma.
 - iv. Students living in a home whose occupants have limited ability to speak and understand English.
- 3. Students four years of age (prior to 7/31 of the current year) qualifying as a resident
 - a. "Resident" includes students living within the Lakeview Community Schools District (LCS) boundaries.
- 4. Students three years of age (prior to 7/31 of the current year) qualifying as a resident
 - a. "Resident" includes students living within the Lakeview Community Schools District (LCS) boundaries.
- 5. LCS will consider option students for the preschool program at this time with the following criteria:
 - a. Option student with an older sibling currently enrolled at LCS through the Enrollment Option Program.
 - b. Son or daughter of LCS District Employee.
 - c. Students who were previously enrolled in the Lakeview Preschool Program.
 - d. Students who do not qualify as "at risk" or as "resident".

Submitting an application does not guarantee placement in the preschool program. Students will be placed by age according to the priority list.

Non-Resident Students

Non-resident students are welcome to submit an application to the Lakeview Preschool program. Parents who are considering this option need to understand the regulations for non-resident students and should visit with the superintendent or the elementary principal before making a final decision. All students will be placed according to the priority placement list.

Enrollment Criteria

- 1. Valid birth certificate
- 2. Up-to-Date Immunization record. Nebraska State law dictates that immunization records must be presented at the time of enrollment or that student cannot be enrolled.
- 3. All students must be potty-trained before attending preschool, unless otherwise stated in an IEP.
- 4. Free/Reduced Family Application, if applicable.

Applications will not be accepted without all documents.

Dear Kindergarten through 6th Grade Platte Center Parents/Guardians,

Platte Center Elementary grades K-6 will be participating in a very special community service program to raise funds for the American Heart Association. 
