March is here! I love the hope and enthusiasm that March brings when people start getting outside, the days get longer, and the doldrums of winter become a distant memory. In education, March is the month we begin to think about not only finishing the year strong but preparing to be even better next year. With that in mind, we have several projects slated for the summer months to improve our facilities and our educational materials. Here is a short list with a few of our major projects:

Finalize construction at Shell Creek Elementary School. This addition will bring six new classrooms to the building that will be utilized for lower elementary grades. These classrooms will reduce primary grade class sizes and accommodate the district's growth.

Addition of a Preschool at Shell Creek Elementary. This will allow both elementary attendance sites to have an early childhood education option.

Textbook adoptions for the Social Studies curriculum will be completed for 2022-23. We are finalizing the review process to ensure a great resource will be chosen.

We will be upgrading all of the student technology rotations for our newly implemented one-to-one program, which includes both Chromebooks and iPads.

Replacing carpet, tile, and lights in the 6th grade classroom at Platte Center.

Replace one air conditioning unit at Platte Center.

Replacing outdated weight room equipment and flooring at Lakeview Jr./Sr. High.

Updating wireless access points at all three buildings.

We are still researching additional district projects to ensure we have the most updated and viable curriculum, modern facilities, and 21st century materials.

Lakeview has made a commitment to providing our students with a premier education! Improvement and growth are the most critical aspects of education, and we are committed to that with our facilities, teaching materials, technology, and instructional practices. Go Vikings!

Lakeview Community Schools Preschool Selection Criteria
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Selection Criteria

Students are placed depending on verified needs, age, and residence.

1. Priority placement for resident students in the special education program who are currently on an IFSP or IEP.
2. Priority placement will be given to resident students "At-Risk":
 - a. "At Risk" includes:
 - i. Students with verified low birth weight (with physician statement).
 - ii. Students whose family income would qualify for Free and Reduced Lunches (income verification form based on *Free & Reduced School Meal Family Application*).
 - iii. Students of teenage parents who have not currently obtained a high school diploma.
 - iv. Students living in a home whose occupants have limited ability to speak and understand English.
3. Students four years of age (prior to 7/31 of the current year) qualifying as a resident
 - a. "Resident" includes students living within the Lakeview Community Schools District (LCS) boundaries.
4. Students three years of age (prior to 7/31 of the current year) qualifying as a resident
 - a. "Resident" includes students living within the Lakeview Community Schools District (LCS) boundaries.
5. LCS will consider option students for the preschool program at this time with the following criteria:
 - a. Option student with an older sibling currently enrolled at LCS through the Enrollment Option Program.
 - b. Son or daughter of LCS District Employee.
 - c. Students who were previously enrolled in the Lakeview Preschool Program.
 - d. Students who do not qualify as "at risk" or as "resident".

Submitting an application does not guarantee placement in the preschool program. Students will be placed by age according to the priority list.

Non-Resident Students

Non-resident students are welcome to submit an application to the Lakeview Preschool program. Parents who are considering this option need to understand the regulations for non-resident students and should visit with the superintendent or the elementary principal before making a final decision. All students will be placed according to the priority placement list.

Enrollment Criteria

1. Valid birth certificate
2. Up-to-Date Immunization record. Nebraska State law dictates that immunization records must be presented at the time of enrollment or that student cannot be enrolled.
3. All students must be potty-trained before attending preschool, unless otherwise stated in an IEP.
4. Free/Reduced Family Application, if applicable.

Applications will not be accepted without all documents.

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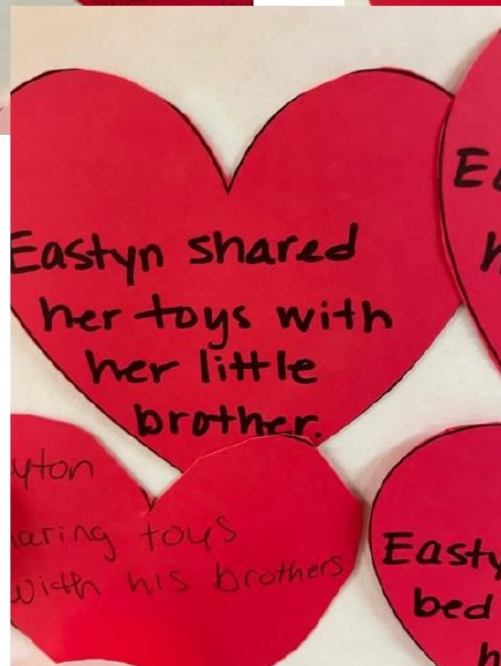
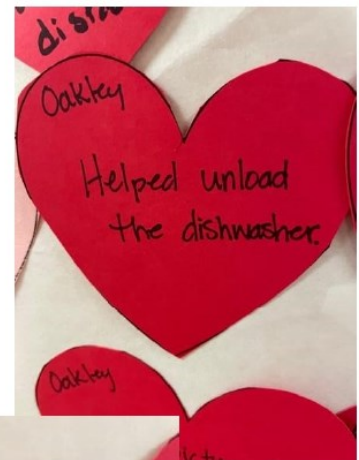
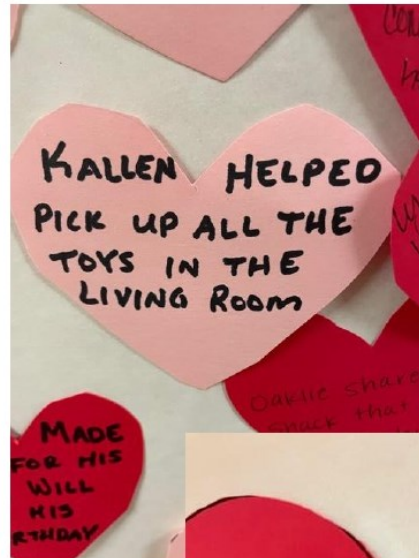

EL News

Students who have been identified as English Learners (ELs) are required to take the English Language Proficiency Assessment for the 21st Century (ELPA21). Each EL student takes four tests to assess their proficiency in reading, writing, speaking, listening to, and understanding English. ELs take this test each year until they demonstrate proficiency in all four domains the same year. ELPA21 defines “proficiency” as the ability to use the English language to communicate ideas, knowledge, and information. Shell Creek’s EL students have been working hard this month to show their growth in acquiring the English language.

In & Around Shell Creek Elementary...

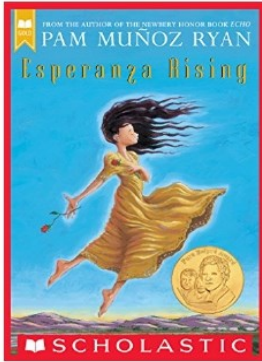
When children are starting to learn to read there are 5 components that they will learn to help them become successful readers. The 5 components to reading are phonics, phonemic awareness, vocabulary, fluency, and reading comprehension. As a teacher we focus on these 5 areas. We look at students' strengths and weaknesses in reading. All five areas are different but build on each other to help students' become sufficient readers.

First, phonics is connecting sounds and letters to make words. To help students' and myself remember what phonics is, is to remember you have to have the lights on to do this. You have to be able to see the letters on a page and connect it with a sound to create a word. Then, phonemic awareness, this is only the sounds of letters. You can have the lights off, you only need to hear those sounds. Next, vocabulary, this is very important as a reader. Being able to identify the meaning of the words will help a reader understand what the story is about. Then, fluency is the pace the reader is reading a story. If they can connect sounds to letters and read the whole words they will be able to read more fluent and be able to read the words correctly. Last, reading comprehension is remembering what they read. This is hard for students' because they focus on reading the words correctly and fluently that they do not always remember what they read. When reading with your child remember to ask questions and have them explain what they are reading.

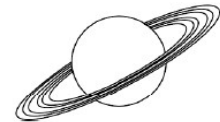
In & Around Shell Creek Elementary School...



To start off 3rd quarter, the 5th graders read the novel *Esperanza Rising* by Pam Munoz Ryan. Before reading, the students learned a little about the Great Depression and the Mexican Revolution, to give them some background information to better understand what was going on during this time period. Also, each chapter is titled with the name of a food having to do with the story in some way, so the students were given the opportunity to try the different foods – some included: grapes, avocados, potatoes, onions, asparagus, guavas, and figs! Some 5th graders had never eaten or seen many of the food items so it was a great experience for them.



To finish up 3rd quarter, the 5th graders will be diving into all things fractions in math and will gain some foundational understanding of how to add, subtract, multiply, and divide them. Then in Science, students will continue to learn about space – planets and their relationship in size and distance



from each other, sky patterns, how earth rotates and revolves, and the moon's phases. In Social Studies, 5th graders will be learning about the American Revolution: causes, battles, influential people from both sides, and the outcomes. In writing, students will finish reviewing figurative language and then will be working on biographies using Canva to organize and present their research.

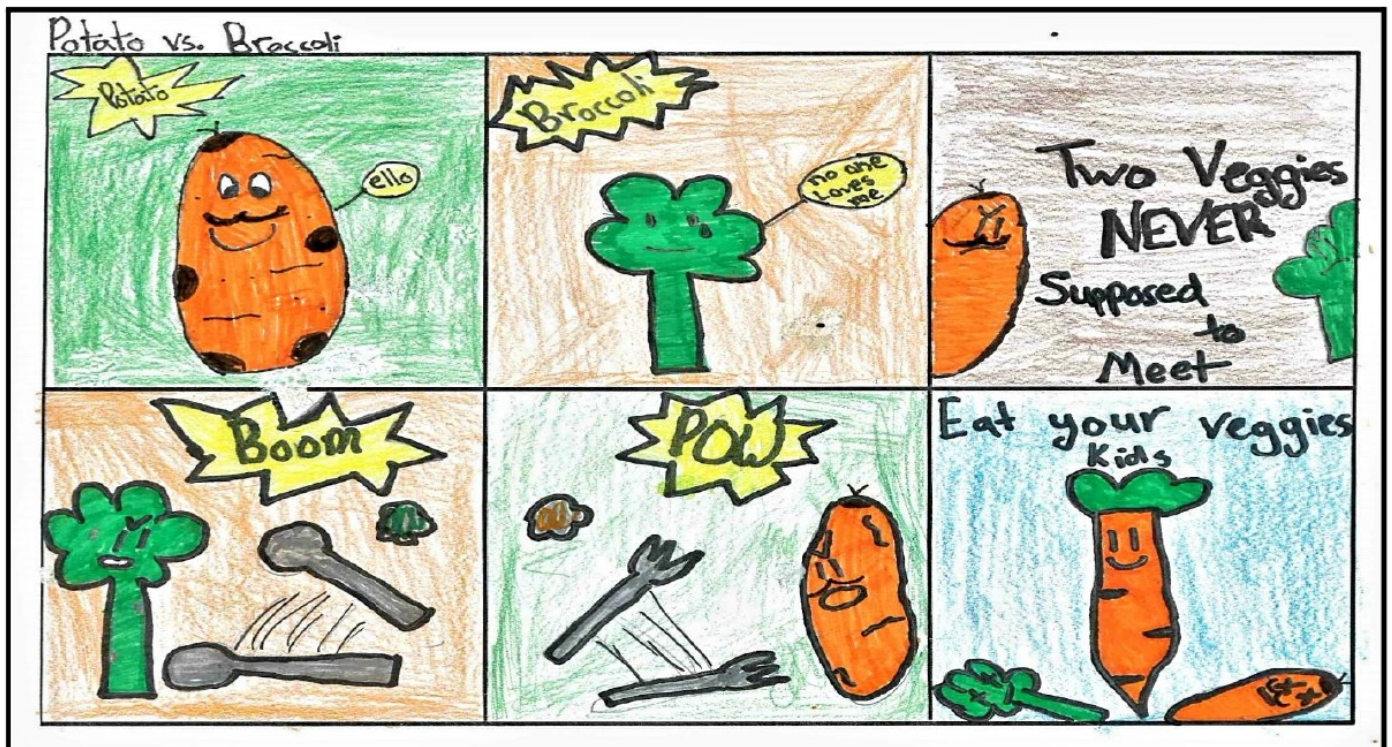
