5th Grade 4H Leadership Day

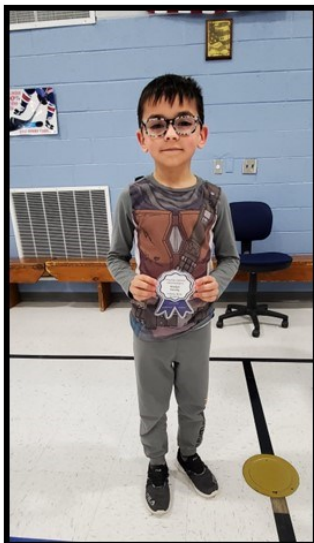

On April 11 and 13, the 5th grade students at Shell Creek took part in a 4H Leadership Day presented by Jayd Roberts. Students learned exactly what leadership is, entails, and looks like. Students then took a survey to figure out what type of Leadership qualities they possess. Shell Creek students soon realized how different everyone in their class was from one another and why they may think differently than their peers around them. Students were later immersed into many leadership activities and examples throughout the day. The first activity involved our students' listening skills. Jayd read a story that had the words right, left, front, and behind buried within. As she read the story, students had to pass Popsicle sticks in the correct direction. Then students had to work in groups to get a tennis ball in a cup using only a giant washer and ten strings attached to it. Finally, they worked together to build a free standing tower with PVC Pipe. Jayd added in extra challenges by picking people that weren't allowed to talk and only being able to use one hand to build. Students really saw what it was like to work together and as a team! Overall, students learned and discussed leadership qualities that can be used in the classroom and everyday life along with realizing the differences that makeup our unique classrooms.

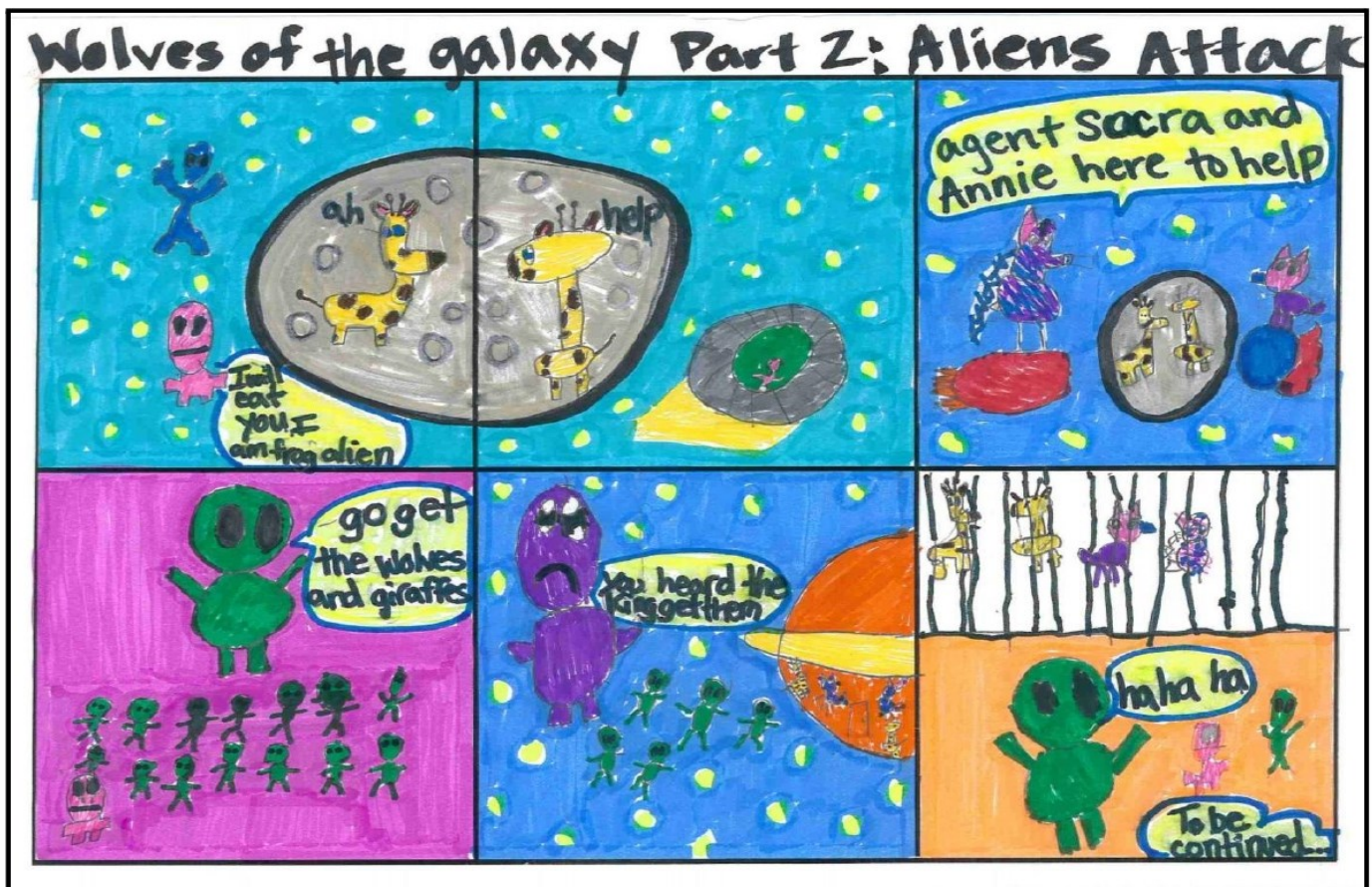

Happy Easter from Christ Lutheran School! We are excited to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and spread the news of salvation.

The Christ Lutheran Annual Plant Sale concluded on April 4th. We met and exceeded our goal for this year. Thank you to all who purchased plants, to the PTL and to Janet's Jungle for this fundraiser. Plant Pick Up Day is Wednesday, April 26th.

Christ Lutheran celebrated The Week of the Young Child during the first full week of April. The purpose of this week is to focus public attention on the needs of young children, their families, and teachers to recognize the early childhood programs and serves that meet those needs. Each day had a theme such as Music Monday, Tasty Tuesday, and Artsy Thursday. On Friday, the 5th-8th grade students helped serve lunch to the childcare families.

On April 12th the Columbus Commodores visited. Christ Lutheran recently joined the Columbus Chamber of Commerce. We are excited about this new partnership.

Wednesday, April 13th the Preschool-8th grade students participated in "family group" activities. The students were divided into multi-age small groups. Each teacher led a group in a project for 30 minutes, and then the groups rotated to another classroom. For example, one project was weaving paper Easter baskets and filling them with treats for people in the nursing homes.



During the month of April, the third through eighth grade student participate in MAPS testing. These computerized adaptive tests adjust in difficulty as the students answer questions. The scores reflect individual progress and growth when compared to previous results.

Students have enjoyed several field trips during the fourth quarter. Mrs. Murray's class visited an art museum in Lincoln, toured the UNL food science building, and then made their own ice cream. Ms. Weber's class is going to Lincoln to participate in a Bob Ross painting class, and then also visit the food science building. At the end of April, K-8 students will go to Camp Luther for a day of outdoor education. Then in May, the K-1st classroom is going to the Edgerton Explorit Center while the 2nd-4th graders are going to the Stuhr Museum.

Next week we will be starting dioramas on books we read so far this year. In Math we continue to plug away with multiplication and division. Big Room News: The Big Room is reading the Bronze Bow in literature. Our main character, Daniel, just met Jesus! We can't wait to see what happens next.
