Make-Up Work Policy

Lakeview Community Schools Policy

A MINIMUM of two school days will be allowed to make up work for each day missed. If make-up work is not completed, students will receive no credit for the work required. Teachers are responsible for clearly communicating the deadline expectation. The student has the responsibility to contact teachers initially, regarding make-up assignments. If the parents or students have concerns they are encouraged to contact the teacher.

Absence due to ISS

Students who miss class do not have to make up the points missed for that day, however, they are responsible to meet with the teacher to learn the material they missed for the day.

Late Work Policy

Late work is defined as any work that was not turned in by the specified deadline. Teachers are responsible for clearly communicating the deadline expectation.

When is work considered as late?
(i.e. beginning of class, end of class, end of day)

A deadline will be given by the teacher for each assignment. If the assignment is not completed by the deadline, it is considered late.

What are the consequences for late work?

Zeroes

When are the zeroes recorded?

After the due date or revised due date has passed.

Are zeroes permanent? If no, how do students fix it?	No. Once students have completed the assignment, students will receive full credit. Students have until the end of the current grading period to complete the assignment.

Daily Work	No	Daily grades are based on participation so they are not able to be redone or corrected. Participation points will not be deducted for absences.
Quizzes/Tests	Yes	Failed quizzes and tests may be retaken once, and the higher grade will be recorded. Retakes must be scheduled with the teacher no more than three school days after the original quiz or test has been taken.
Performances/Concerts	No	Performances/Concerts are set in advance and are not able to be redone. A student may send a video/audio recording of the selections done at the concert/performance for partial credit.
