This year Lakeview Community Schools is prepared to educate more kids district-wide than it has in the last 23 years as a PK-12 school district. District Theme

We appreciate your flexibility and understanding as we navigate these changes. The final results of the new building are going to be fantastic, and we are incredibly excited to provide these additional services to our students.
