


# We are going paperless!

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# From the Desk of the Superintendent

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## MATH CURRICULUM ADOPTION

We are excited to share with you the progress made by Lakeview Community Schools over the past 12 months. The school district has undertaken a math curriculum adoption process for K-12th grades, one of the most important practices a school district takes on. Math is a core subject that teaches critical thinking, problem-solving, opens career paths, promotes financial literacy, and develops analytical thinking. Lakeview has done an outstanding job of ensuring that the new math curriculum will be viable and current with best educational practices. Elementary teachers, junior high teachers, high school teachers, administrators, parents, educational service unit professionals, and the Board of Education were all included in the decision-making process. Through in-person meetings and feedback, several different options were identified, which were then reduced to a final two. To ensure that the final decision was well-informed, a team of teachers visited schools that were currently using the curriculums to see them in action. These measures were then reported back to the entire group for a decision to be made. The resulting recommendation to the board of education for a new K-12 math curriculum will ensure that Lakeview students are being set up for academic success in the years to come. While any change to a curriculum can be challenging, we are confident that Lakeview's new math curriculum will push our students forward and produce excellent results in future years. We are grateful for the input of all those who participated in the decision-making process and look forward to the continued success of Lakeview Community Schools.

## EARLY DISMISSALS AND PLC'S

The second and fourth Wednesdays of each month are early dismissals throughout the district for our teachers to engage in our Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). PLCs are a systematic process in which teachers work together to analyze and improve their classroom practices. Teachers work in collaborative teams, engaging in discussions in which they share expertise and collaborate to improve teaching skills and the academic performance of students. These meetings help to ensure that we have a great district-wide curriculum at the elementary grade levels, expanded learning within each department at the junior/senior high levels, excellent transitions in curriculum between grade levels and buildings, and advancements within our curriculum so that we continue to improve instead of staying stagnant. In addition, this time can be used to push forward district-wide initiatives such as school safety and security, curriculum adoption, and more.

We know these early dismissals can create some hardships for families, as they create the need to schedule daycare, pick up children at odd times, and create irregularity within the normal schedule. We are definitely sympathetic to these issues and want you to know that these early outs are not done lightly or without reason. We feel that the educational outcomes of our students improve dramatically by allowing the PLCs to take place. We appreciate everyone making the sacrifices on the early dismissal days to allow this professional development to take place, ensuring that we make Lakeview one of the best districts possible!


# Viking Way Student of the Month


