FFA Happenings!

During the last week of March, our FFA chapter brought 58 members to the Nebraska State FFA Convention. Each member that made the trip to Lincoln competed in a Leadership Development Event or Career Development Event. These events are designed to test a member's knowledge on a variety of skills. While at the convention our chapter earned a silver rating on our National Chapter awards, we received the 2023 NIFA grant, and we entered the hall of chapters.

At the end of senior year an FFA member has the right to apply for their state degree. This degree is the third degree a member can earn, preceded by the Greenhand Degree and the Chapter Degree. Members need to show exemplary community service, active membership, and must have a Supervised Agricultural Experience to receive this degree. Eight Lakeview FFA members were awarded this degree at the convention: Tori Osten, Rori Reese, Ashton Stubbert, Niels Schmidt, MaKenna Lutjelusche, Elly Luchsinger, Grace Berkeland, and Kaden Gehring. In the coming years, these members may apply for the coveted American Degree, which is presented at the National Convention.

Each member of an FFA Chapter may choose to have a Supervised Agricultural Experience. Members can then fill out a proficiency application to highlight these SAE's. This year three Lakeview FFA Members were finalists at state for their proficiency applications. Adyson Grotelucshen was the state runner-up in the beef entrepreneur category. 




