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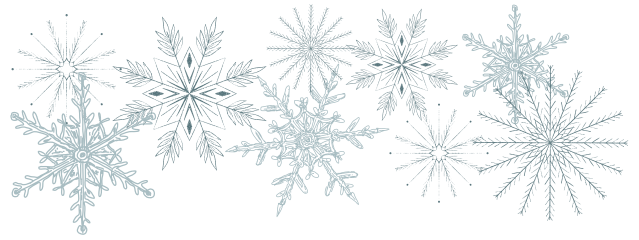
## Senior Pictures Due Now! Last Chance!

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## **“Blessed to be a Blessing”**

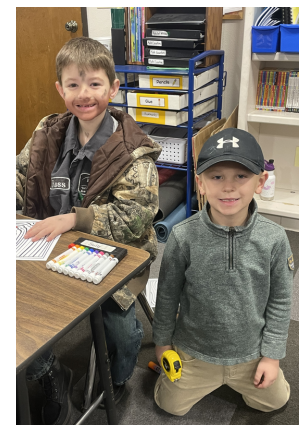

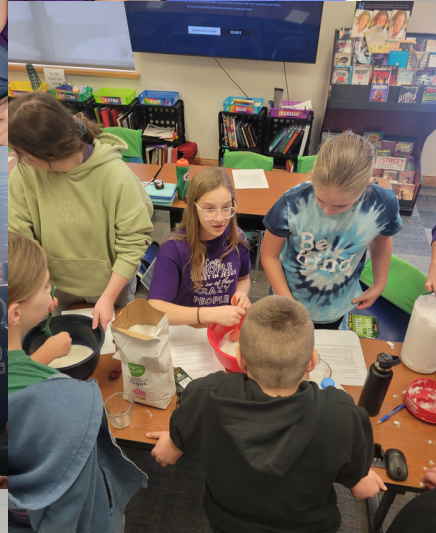

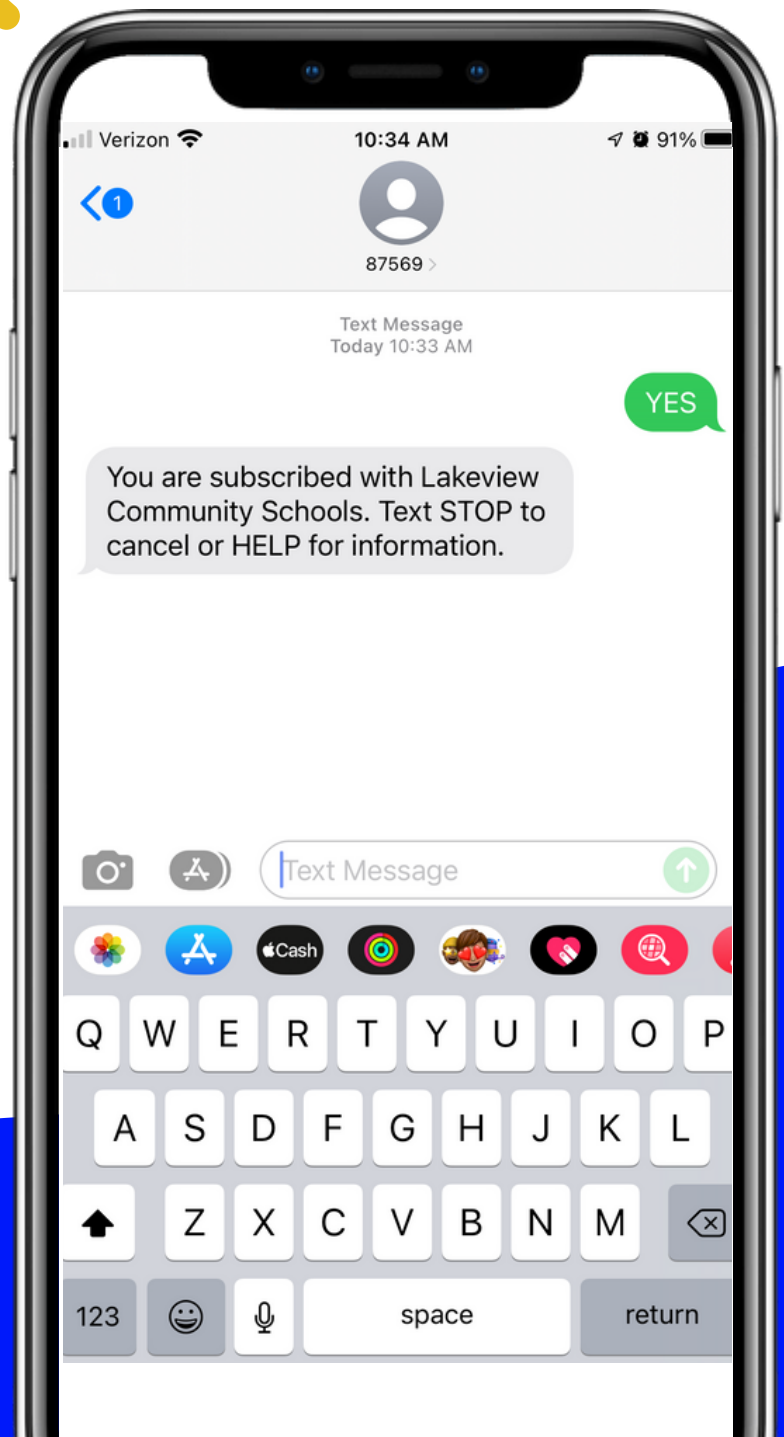
